White Bridge Link: Progress Update and **User Survey**

Plans for this exciting new cycling and footpath link between Steyning, Bramber and Upper Beeding are gathering pace.

The two drop-in events held in April to get feedback on the scheme were both well attended. They showed there is an encouraging degree of local support for the idea of creating

a safe, all-weather route between the three communities suitable for walkers, bikes, pushchairs and mobility scooters. Here's a sample of the comments received:

'Brilliant idea – my whole family would definitely use it.'

'Great job guys – please make this happen.' 'A superb initiative... we are thrilled at the thought of our children being able to cycle to school.'

'I have a mobility scooter... this will enable me to get out Steyning and along the river which I of this campaign until more of the funding is in cannot do at the moment.'

Whilst feedback was significantly in favour of the project, some concerns were also raised, which will be investigated and reported back on. With designs now well advanced, the relevant permissions obtained, and initial contractors' quotes submitted, the next step is to raise the funds to make it happen!

There's good news on that front too. A local charitable trust has made a commitment in principle to provide £125,000 towards the

overall project cost of between £250,000 and £300,000. And bids have been submitted to a number of other potential funders.

There are also plans afoot for a crowdfunding campaign to raise part of the costs from the local community. To avoid uncertainty, a decision has been made to hold off the launch place. So keep your eye out for news on this. To help strengthen the project's fundraising efforts, a short user survey is being conducted to gauge how people would use the new paths and see who might be willing to contribute to a crowdfunding appeal.

I am an Artist, Designer and Maker of handmade small batch ceramics inspired by the beautiful South Downs where I live in the small town of Stevning, West Sussex.

My ceramics are all unique individuals, organic in their nature and often functional pieces for the home. I like to create cherished to flow into my hands and let the creation pieces you can enjoy holding, using and looking at.

They are all handmade using traditional methods of pinching, coiling and slabbuilding. I like to use stoneware and porcelain clay and use coloured glazes, underglazes and coloured slips for decoration.

This means they are never identical and each one carries the mark of my making - bumps, dents, fingertips - revealing the handmaking nature rather than the uniformity of factory made.

I love the feel of the clay and my best work is often achieved when I simply allow an idea evolve.

Restoring Extinct Species



Greening Steyning have been working with Emer Nicholson at the Towers to develop a small gardening club which has

been very successful and has utilised the large greenhouse on that site. The children have really enjoyed growing flowers, salad and vegetables and we hope to expand this next year as Derek at Daylands Farm is keen to be involved.

As a side effect of working with the school and talking to Matthew at the Stevning Downland Scheme (SDS) we were able to connect the school with a project that Matthew was developing with Wakehurst Place to reintroduce a plant currently extinct in Sussex. The Star Fruit (Damasonium Alisma) is a wetland plant that has been extinct for over a 100 years and is ideally suited to the area around the upper pond in the SDS.

A small group of children from the Towers visited Wakehurst Place where Star Fruit seeds are held in the Millenium Seed Bank. Wakehurst have germinated some seeds and taught the children how to do this for themselves. The children are now trying to incubate their own Star Fruit seeds, which is difficult because they are 'incredibly fussy little seeds', and if successful will then plant them around the SDS pond. This has been a wonderful opportunity for the children to learn about how Wakehurst are working to maintain our biodiversity and then

actually be involved in an important project for the local area. We all owe Matthew and Emer a big 'Thank You!' for making this happen. - Robin Johnson, volunteer

Exploring No-Dig

The year 5 children at Steyning Primary were studying 'sowing and growing' this term and the Schools Liaison team at Greening Steyning offered to go into the school and work with the children to help them learn about 'No-Dig' gardening. The plan was to talk to them about the concepts that underly no-dig gardening and soil health, show them a short video that Charles Dowding (the originator of the approach) has released where he shows children how to create a no-dig vegetable

patch from scratch and then actually build two no-dia patches. Simon Parker did a lively and interactive talk with the children, the video went down



well and the children had a lot of fun building their new no-dig patches.



King Apple Loses His Head!

It's just been confirmed by the Met Office, that June was the hottest and driest on record. Who Knew! Those of us with gardens, pots, vegetable patches and allotments will not be surprised by that information, having spent the last few weeks endlessly watering trying to keep plants and seedlings alive (and trying not to use too much water in the process!) As I write this article, we have just had some very welcome rain, with more due, although it's coinciding nicely with Wimbledon and Ashes Test Matches!!

The trees in our orchards having thrived after a wet Spring are varying in their ability to cope in the hot weather. The older trees seem to be coping reasonably well as they are more established and have a decent root system able to access the deeper underground water. The newer trees and especially the ones planted this year in the MPF and Abbey Road, need a little more TLC with regular watering and keeping an eye out for pest/diseases as they have been stressed through the lack of water and high temperature, making them less resilient. Thanks go to all the volunteers and their watering cans.

We have a Steyning Scarlet apple tree in our garden which was covered in blossom in the Spring, with most of the fruit setting. However, as it's still a relatively young tree we knew that most of the fruit would not grow and ripen, so we took the decision to remove all the small fruit bar three, enabling it to concentrate all its resources into establishing itself. If we hadn't, the tree may have still had a 'June Drop'. This is where a tree will naturally discard excess fruit.

Sometimes though, nature needs a hand, especially if the trusses are crowded and there is a heavy crop, as apples trees can only support a limited number of fruit. Start thinning by removing the King Apple – the one at the centre of the cluster. Leave one or two fruits every 4-5 ins for dessert apples, 1 fruit every 6-8 ins for cookers and with regular watering (rain or manually), there

should be ripe apples in the autumn. (see pics)

When are apples ripe?
One of the first signs are windfalls around the tree.

Taste test – sounds obvious really. Discovery apples and other early varieties can be eaten straight from the tree, but other later maturing fruit need a period of storage before being ready. One of the ways to check if a Cox's apple is ready to eat is to shake it and if you can hear the seeds rattle it's ripe.

Pip colour - cut an apple in half and if the pips have changed colour from white to brown, they're ready. If not, wait awhile before harvesting. (Advice from Carol Klein –Grow Your Own Fruit)

We now have an anxious wait to see how many trees will be bearing fruit this year. Not just for eating, but for our annual **JUICING DAY**, which will be held on Sunday 10th September 13:00 - 16.00, in the orchard on the Memorial Playing Field.

Come along with your apples and have a go at chopping, scrunching and pressing and take home some juice (for a small donation – cash only).

Can I get a mortgage?

A conventional mortgage is where you combine your deposit to whatever your income dictates you can borrow, to establish at what level you can buy at.

Personal income is the key in these cases. Quite often people think that if they have a large deposit it allows them to borrow more. This is not necessarily the case as the in this scenario the higher the deposit the lower the rate is likely to be rather than increased borrowing.

Other factors that dictate how much can be borrowed are credit score/history, age, dependents and a host of individual lender criteria.

When securing a conventional mortgage, there are typically two types of rate available, fixed and variable.

With rates increasing it could be a good time to reinstate a capped rate mortgage that was a feature of mortgages previously.

The beauty of a capped rate is that the cap is the highest the rate can reach, but if rates start to reduce then the mortgage payments could also come down.

If a conventional mortgage is unavailable then there is the option of shared ownership which we've covered before.

This is often referred to as a part buy part rent scheme.

Usually the property is purchased from a housing association and if buying a property via a conventional mortgage is just out of reach, this product allows people to start off by buying as little as 25% of a property's value and pay rent on the rest.

The scheme normally allows you to gradually increase the percentage you own and this is called staircasing.

Other schemes could be introduced in future by lenders as we've lost the Help to Buy scheme which was immensely popular.



Steyning Primary School Music teacher Sarah Pargeter retires

Thirty-seven years in education have meant hard work, fun and learning for music teacher Sarah Pargeter, but after almost 30 of those years devoted to Stevning Primary School, she is hanging up her baton, calling time (no metronome required) and retiring at the end of this school year.

In the early days, as class teacher, she was determined to bring music into the lives of every pupil and made it her mission to ensure that they would all experience playing a musical instrument before moving on to pastures new. Her school shows were memorable, not least for their humour and musical celebration, and most impressively because she made sure every year group was involved in one of three, yes three, Christmas shows she produced every year. Keen to pull in all the creative arts, she sought advice from friend and colleague Jeanette Brady, who frequently suggested choreography. Sarah would create stick drawings to represent movement, adding her own unique choreographic notation - 'start shape step or turn with a flippy foot three times.' Bob Fosse, eat your heart out!

At the turn of the millennium, West Sussex Music Support offered an outreach programme providing peripatetic music lessons, which Sarah grabbed with both hands. When they suggested introducing brass lessons, Sarah encouraged a group of boys to have a go and, even though they only started a term before, she was keen to showcase their talents in the summer concert. As proud parents watched on, they were wowed by the impressive orchestra she had produced over the last few years.

Finally, out came the newly assembled brass group, who impressed with their group piece. It was during an ambitious tuba solo that the wheels began to fall off. There had been a lot of tuneful and assertive parumphing before a few bum notes were played and the music halted momentarily, as Sarah gently encouraged the now slightly less assertive boy to go for it. More hesitation before he let rip with his tuba, producing the most alarming and hysterical squeak. The audience were trying desperately not to laugh, but the look of abject horror on his face followed by his and Mrs Pargeter's giggles,

set a perfect tone. and, needless

to say, he received the loudest applause that evening.

Over time, Sarah was appointed music teacher for the whole school and continued her goal to provide experiences for her pupils. She was instrumental in bringing the family group of local primary schools together to plan singing lessons for Years 4, 5 and 6, with their transition to the Grammar School a firm focus. She entered the into the annual Sussex music festival every year and worked tirelessly within the community to provide concerts for many events, too numerous to mention. It should also be acknowledged that she has given invaluable support to Junior Theatre over the years and to Stevning Festival in its infancy.

In recent years, she has organised trips to London where pupils have taken part in the Big Sing, now known as Young Voices, at the O2. What better gift for a child than to perform with the largest choir in the world on the biggest stage in the UK? This has been her proudest achievement to date, superseded only by her relief that she never lost a child amongst the 9000 present.

Sarah has earned the right to take life at a more leisurely pace, but with all that generosity, drive and passion, she will be sorely missed by staff and pupils alike, and we wish her much happiness for the next chapter. Surely there was an end of term party to give her the send-off she deserved? Indeed, there was, but you've guessed it, it was hosted by none other than the Marvellous Mrs Pargeter herself, and she wouldn't have it any other way.



August: Steyning for Trees

On the Steyning in Bloom open day Katie Parker our committee member, (of Sussex wWildlife TRust,)

showed you all the work that SFT has done to rewild Shooting Field Green at the request of the residents. We have planted mini copses and trees to support diverse species, designed by David



Buckett our co-chair. I know many of you were taught all things environmental by him at Steyning Grammar School.

We arranged for U3A Natural History Group to visit Iping and Stedham Common with Neil Hulme to see the Silver Studded Blue butterfly so we were pleased that Springwatch was also featuring this rare butterfly. They talked about its symbiotic relationship with black ants.

Dr. Darren Moorcroft of the Woodland Trust speaking again on the Today programme was saying only half of the government tree target is being planted. He repeated that the UK has the fewest trees in Europe. He feels there is not enough investment in Nurseries and talked about the difficulties to establish seedlings with increasing risk of prolonged droughts. We are certainly finding fewer saplings available.

Yes, its official 'the hottest June on record'. As the Wildlife Trust says 'Nature is being pounded by extreme weather'. I expect some of you are aware that the newly planted trees at Canons Way have been showing signs of stress. Thanks to those who notified us, we were already on the case. Our watering contractor had come out to show us how difficult the access had become. The grass had not been cut recently by WSCC.

We gathered our wonderful volunteers together and many thanks to Cllr. Simon Alexander who came and helped us. Access paths were cut, the trees were mulched, and we have been watering regularly. The contractors came watering and putting down some magic mix and grateful for the emotional support that we gain fingers crossed there are signs of green. We wont know for certain that they are saved till next spring. WSCC are obliged to replace them under their planting scheme, particularly as they were selected by them.

Well done everyone who has been doing a wonderful job watering their trees on the

verges. We only use contractors in larger planted areas where there is no one specific 'verger', but I know many of you help us there too, also looking after neighbours trees when they are away. Great community spirit working together for the good of the planet.

The Woodland Trust says A £1bn five year plan is needed to save England's ancient forests, which are more polluted, damaged and contain less wildlife than at any point in history.

Michael Blencowe the well-known sussex naturalist and author has offered to do a talk for Stevning for Trees about the Lost Woods Scheme here which extends from Pulborough to Lewis. This is concerned with preserving older woodland and will be on 9th October in the Community Centre at 19:30. Michael, as many of you know is a excellent, amusing and knowledgeable speaker.

In the Broadleaf magazine Charity Wakefield talks movingly about Trees and Me. Her experience with the Tree Listening Project where a recording device was attached to a big old oak. She says 'it was soothing to hear the inner workings of this huge rooted being, incredible like listening to the lifeblood pumping through its veins.'

I think many of us have experiences and moments in our lives when we have been from leaning against an ancient tree.

The Countryside Charity (CPRE) are co-hosting a Countryside Day Out at Knepp on 2nd September. It is to celebrate Knepp Estate's new Wilding Cafe and Shop and Sussex CPRE's 50th Anniversary. The Woodland Trust has a stall.

Water Shrew

I love Jaws, the 1975 movie which sent three men out into the Atlantic on a fishing boat in search of a marauding Great White Shark.

There's another aquatic monster hunting in the ponds and shallow streams of Sussex. But to find a Water Shrew... you're gonna need a smaller boat.

Water Shrews weigh 15g and measure just 16cm. Unlike other shrews they have an amazing ability to swim and hunt underwater. They're covered in dense fur – vital insulation against the cold and wet. This sleek wetsuit also pretty impressive. traps air bubbles, transforming the shrew into a furry Aero helping it stay buoyant. Powerful, extra hairy hind feet propel this tiny torpedo through the water.

Water Shrews and Great White Sharks have a common feature that sets them apart from their close relatives. They both have a striking demarcation between their dark upperparts and their white underparts. Looking from above, their black backs blend with the pond bottom or seabed. From below, their pale bellies make them invisible in the sunlit water. It's a submarine survival strategy that helps conceal both hunters and hunted. And the Water Shrew is both

With sharp, red-tipped fangs, a Water Shrew's jaws are as fearsome as any shark's. But the Water Shrew has a trick up its teeth. It's Britain's only venomous mammal. When it bites it injects a stupefying saliva which subdues its victims.

In Jaws, the grizzled skipper Quint (Robert Shaw) relates the chilling true tale of the torpedoed WWII cruiser Indianapolis, which sank leaving hundreds of sailors adrift in sharkinfested waters. Well, my mate Barry was once

bitten by a Water Shrew in Newhaven and his finger went all tingly for about two hours. OK, it doesn't exactly compare, but the fact that a tiny shrew can make such an impact on a human is

Slice open a dead shrew's stomach and rummage inside and you'll find bits of beetle legs, snail shells, and fishbones. They are relentless, frenetic hunters. If the shrew goes without a meal for more than an hour it will die.

What we are dealing with here is a perfect engine, an eating machine. All this machine does is swim and eat and make little shrews. Between April and September, the mating of the shrew can produce 2-3 litters of 3-15 young. They live a fast, brief life. Few of them will survive for more than a year.

The best way to see a Water Shrew is to sit by a Sussex stream as the sun sets. Bring a couple of friends and some Apricot Brandy, share some tall tales, and wait for a shrew to strike.

August Gardening Journal

August is a great time to enjoy the long Summer evenings in your garden, it's a time of rich colour, flavour and texture. The late summer perennials and statuesque ornamental grasses will be coming into their own right now and the veg gardens will be bursting with produce, ready to fill our kitchens with fresh vegetables straight to the plate. It's a guieter time in the gardening so put the spade down and make the most of the hard work completed earlier in the year.

Cephalaria gigantea, known as the 'Giant Scabious', is an unusual hardy perennial that forms a woody rootstock with fine cut, aromatic leaves above which large lime/ yellow scabious type flowers are carried on strong branched stems up to 2m. Although of planting schemes.

Cephalaria is a species of flowering plant in the honeysuckle family Caprifoliaceae - native to the Caucasus region but also cultivated as an ornamental. This erect perennial has deciduous leaves, and pale yellow, ruffled flower heads in summer which require full sun to part shade and a moist, fertile but well drained soil to bring out its best.

The Giant Scabious is perfect for creating an informal cottage garden look and is perfect in loose planting schemes, combined with ornamental grasses or other herbaceous

perennials. Considering its overall size it has an airy and delicate look which is great placed at the back of a mixed border or mixed among large trees or shrubs. Its an easy going perennial which is self-supporting in a sheltered position, doesn't really have it's a big plant it can be used in a broad range any pests or diseases and is also attractive to bees and butterflies too.

> As Cephalaria is on the large side and you can create a more compact, bushier plant by giving it the "Chelsea chop" in Mid May. This will mean you still get the flowers but it wont need so much space in your borders. If you are lucky enough to have room then its best to leave it and cut back when it starts to look tatty, it will then repeat flower in September if you cut back after that first flush of flowers.

Cephalria makes a dramatic yet informal statement in the border, although tall, it isn't overbearing, it looks great with other naturalistic perennials like Echinops,

Echinacea, Persicaria and Helenium, Combine these with Perovskia, Sedum, Pennisteum and Miscanthus and you have a combination of plants that will take you all the way into the autumn.

Jobs to do this month include:

- Continue to deadhead, especially dahlias which should be looking great by now.
- Weed!!! shouldn't be too much of this but Clip evergreen shrubs its best to keep on top of it.
- Keep the lawn mown and edges cut due to dry weather you may need to raise the height of the cut if you want to keep your lawn green.
- Trim hedges now the birds have finished nesting now's the time to get your hedges back in order
- Water Any plants that are looking a bit tired and are wilting, are in need of a drink. If they look really bad, then water immediately and then top up later in the day when its cooler.
- If you have any meadow areas, then these

should be cut, and the hay raked asap.

- · Spray and feed roses.
- · Plant out autumn flowering bulbs eg colchicum.
- Remove lavender stalks and trim bush leaving some green fresh foliage.
- Order spring flowering bulbs.
- · Fnsure camellias have sufficient water to ensure flowers for next year.
- · Prune current seasons growth of wisteria back to 5-6 leaves.

Vegetable Garden:

- Harvest Garlic
- · Sow oriental greens such as mizuna and mibuna, pak choi etc.
- · Harvest early apples.
- · Start lifting main crop potatoes.
- · Summer prune trained fruit such as espalier apples, pears etc.
- Trim non-flowering stems of grapes cutting back to one leaf from the main branch.

A Steyning Farm – and its dung – in the 18th century

If you head up the road towards Ashurst you will come to a track on your right which follows the line of the Roman 'Greensand Way'. It leads to Huddlestone Farm and, in the eighteenth century, if you had set off along this track, there is a very good chance that you would have passed a dung cart with an ox between the shafts and a farm labourer with his dung spud.

When an inventory was taken on the death of farmer Charles Groome, in 1757, he had four dung carts plus eight dung spuds used to dig the dung from one of the four large heaps of dung mix on his farm and to spread it on his fields. It was meticulously recorded that the six acre 'Tickners Field' had not only been 'twice plow'd and twice harrowed' but that they had then spread 'fifty-three loads of dung on the same'.

Even more effort had been put into the preparation of the eleven acre 'Beech Field'; it had been 'four times ploughed and four times harrowed and one hundred and thirty two loads of dung spread on it'.

The soil in the ten-acre 'Conduit Field' appears to have been too acidic and merited different treatment. It needed 'three 'kilns' of lime' and 'sixty loads of mudd'. The lime was made by burning chalk and Charles Groome had a stock

of 4,000 kiln faggots for that purpose together with hedgerow trimmings.

'Furze on the hill' was also valued but was used in the home rather than on the farm; it produced a particularly hot flame for baking.

The reference to 'furze on the hill' suggests

that the farm included land on the Downs and this certainly sits well with the fact that the inventory listed 657 sheep, differentiated in all sorts of ways.


There were, for instance, fatting sheep, four teethed sheep, two teethed culls sheep, wether lambs, fatting lambs, six teethed wethers, fatting ewes, old ewes and 'store' ewes. The number of teeth were a measure of the age of the sheep, 'culls' were inferior animals from the flock which had been separated out for selling and wethers were castrated male sheep kept for their wool. 'Store' sheep were animals intended for fattening.

There were also seven rams including 'one maggoty ram' which, despite being maggoty, was still deemed to be an asset and was worth ten shillings.

Cattle would seem to have been less important than sheep on Mr. Groome's farm, though they

> no doubt contributed to the dung heaps. There were 52 animals in total. separated into bulls, cows, steers, great runts and little runts – runts in this case being a description of young animals.

On top of that there were 33 oxen. These were draft animals which

would have been used for drawing ploughs, dung carts and the like. They would have been kept busy because, apart from the dung carts, there were four waggons, eight harrows and nine ploughs. Less information is provided, however, on the number of people needed to run the farm. The 'men's room' in the farmhouse had three beds and there was also 'the maid's bedroom' but we don't know how many men and women came in each day from their own cottages.

Charles Groome had died in August when the harvest was in full swing so some of his crops were measured in waggon loads. Two hundred and fifty acres were taken up with the growing of wheat, his main crop, and one hundred of these had already been harvested when he died. Seventy acres were fallow – those fields identified as having been ploughed and 'dunged' – and a further seventy were down to peas – a crop designed to put nitrogen back into the soil.

Yet another seventy acres were devoted to oats and beans (mainly for animal fodder) and

to barley. Seven hay ricks were valued, but nothing was said about the acreage used as meadowland or pasture or its value.

It would seem as if it was only the output of the farm and the work put into it – and, of course, the dung – which were valued, and not the acreage as such.
