News from Bramber Parish Council

Bollards down:

The bollards in The Street have been knocked down on three occasions, once by a passing bus and then by two different cars. BPC have managed to get the bollards mended and repositioned. However, in order to prevent more bollard damage, we have relocated the rubbish bin outside the Maharajah Indian restaurant and moved it closer to the vulnerable bollard. We hope that by making the street furniture more prominent, we can prevent further accidents from happening.

Speed watch on Clays Hill:

You may have seen councillors in florescent, yellow jackets collecting data on Clays Hill. The aim is to encourage drivers to drive more carefully up and down Clays Hill. It is a residential area and residents need to feel safe when walking down the pavement to their homes.

Rubbish collection in Castle Lane:

Castle Lane (the section that runs beside Clays Field) became overgrown and residents received a letter from WSCC to say that the bin lorries could no longer get down the lane.

They asked residents to wheel their bins up to Goring Road. This was not viable since rubbish bins are heavy and pushing them uphill would have been quite a work out! BPC were able to get the foliage cut on either side of the lane and bin lorries can now access the lane.

Christmas Carols:

The Salvation Army delighted us all with their rendition of Christmas carols round the Christmas Tree. It really was a community event... Bramber Parish Council paid for the tree, the Bramber society decorated the tree, the Salvation Army played their instruments and Bramber parishioners sang. 

So if you are concerned about climate issues, why not consider taking control of your money, and moving it to a more ethical bank. You can also contact your current bank via



There isn't a huge range of ethical banks to choose from and some operate online only. However, the feel-good factor of knowing your money is going to invest in worthwhile causes as well as reducing fossil fuel emissions makes it well worth it. Have a look at these options:

• Triodos Bank refuses to invest in fossil fuels and offers complete transparency about all of its investments, so you can see the projects

your money supports.

- The Charity Bank offers savings accounts for people and businesses who want to invest • Nationwide doesn't invest in, or lend to, the ethically. It supports charities by offering loans they couldn't find anywhere else.
- Ecology Building Society was the UK's first dedicated green mortgage provider and is primarily focussed on the environment and building a more sustainable future.
- The Co-operative Bank was considered an ethical bank until it was bought out by a group of US hedge funds, which don't operate in the same way. This makes it a

partially ethical bank, but still better than those listed in the first paragraph.





'Tracing the Rails' - A Nostalgic Journey Along the Stevning Line

Few residents of Bramber, Beeding, or Steyning are unaware that a railway line that once traversed their area, evident from the old line's path alongside the river or the surviving platforms at West Grinstead. There is a certain warm nostalgia for the romantic era of steam trains, which once chugged up the Adur valley, which is a powerful force, especially in creating TV shows.

This is the inspiration behind Upper Beeding residents Chris Kirk and Lou Partridge's decision to research and create a new documentary series about our beloved 'Steyning Line'. This railway once connected Shoreham-by-Sea to Horsham, serving six main stations: Bramber, Steyning, Henfield, Partridge Green, West Grinstead, and Southwater. Sadly, it fell victim to the Beeching cuts in 1966, with only the southern part of the line surviving a little longer to serve the cement works in Upper Beeding.

Director Chris, a seasoned filmmaker, and Producer Lou a talented local artist with production experience, have unearthed a treasure trove of information about the

old line. Railways have always captivated interest, and thankfully, numerous images of the old trains, buildings, rails, and personnel survive. .'We're both intrigued by our local history and heritage,' says Chris. 'For a long time, we've walked and cycled along parts of the old line, now part of the Downs Link'.

'Identifying surviving elements of the old railway sparked our curiosity, and we thought others might share this interest,' Louise adds.

Chris reached out to his long-term friend, radio, and TV broadcaster Stephen Cranford from nearby Worthing, to see if he'd be interested in presenting the series. Stephen's enthusiasm was immediate commenting 1

bit his hand off! I have always adored railways, so to get a job where I'm presenting on a subject, I'm passionate about was a dream come true!'

Joining him is transport historian Mike Jaimes, presenting historic segments on railway operations during the Stevning Line's heyday.

Thus, 'Tracing the Rails' was born. This documentary series will methodically follow the old line from Shoreham to Christ's Hospital, akin to 'Time Team'. Stephen and the team will traverse the paths, uncovering remnants of the line's past by looking at and

exampling what presently remains.

Collaboration with our very own Stevning Museum and the neighbouring Henfield Museum has helped stitch together accounts from the time. The production team connecting people from different local groups to share their knowledge. 'We are very excited to get filming on the proper episodes and releasing them this year'.

'There are quite a few surprises,' reveals Stephen. 'For instance, there's still track at West Grinstead, hidden in the undergrowth, and the original brick railway bridge at Henfield is buried under tonnes of soil! They never demolished it; they just covered it up! Chris said 'if you cross the road at Bramber by the roundabout and walk a little way along the Downslink footpath, you can see a garden shed in the grounds to the left of you. On the shed is the word 'Bramber' which is made from the original lettering that was found buried when they bulldozed the old station. The new landowners recovered all the letters except for the A and recreated the sign!'

The pilot episode, filmed in November and December, premiered on YouTube on New Year's Day. 'It showcases our vision,' explains



current day views, drone unique bird's eye view of the stunning landscape we all call home.

'The special teaser episode of Tracing the Rails has soared to over twenty thousand viewings in under a week' says a delighted Chris, 'and we have thousands

of subscribers who are hungry to see more.' The numbers are going up daily, too!

Chris expresses his gratitude: 'Thank you to everyone who shared their photos, films, and memories'.

Yet, the team are still welcoming contributions. 'Tracing the Rails' is more than a documentary; it's a living history project, revitalising memories for future generations. The community's involvement has been the most pleasant surprise and continues to be a big part of the show.





Steyning Community Orchard. Celebrating our 10th Birthday February 2024!



STEYNING COMMUNITY
ORCHARD

Ten years ago this month, the Steyning Community Orchard (SCO) was born. A committee was gathered, leader elected and what had been a dream in a couple of people's minds started to become a reality.

It had taken two years to reach this point. Meetings with the Steyning Parish Council, specifically the Playing Fields Committee, yielded the permission and the support to re-establish the former orchard of Lewis Wood of Newham Lane. Fruit from this orchard used to be sold in the grocers' shops of Steyning, whilst a pony grazed under the branches of the trees, no doubt enjoying the fallen apples!

The Parish Council acquired the orchard from Lewis Wood, to link this area with the cricket field, and became the Recreation Ground (subsequently the Memorial Playing Field) - an amazing location boasting one of the most beautiful backdrops to a cricket pitch anywhere in the country.

The terms of reference for the SCO project were to re-establish the orchard, saving those trees that could be saved, rescuing some that survived

the hurricane of October '87 and clear the area ready for replanting.

We wanted to create an orchard of trees donated by Steyning residents in memory of family and friends. These donations fund the trees and their maintenance

The planning and planting of this area (and

all the subsequent orchards) has largely been directed by Roger Brown who has a remarkable knowledge of fruit trees, root stocks and grafting, sapling management, and choosing the right apple for the right space. In the MPF he has created a central core of 23 Sussex heritage varieties of apples which is now one of the best, if not the best, collection in Sussex.

The ongoing care is in the hands of the SCO steering group and a band of enthusiastic volunteers who prune, strim and weed on a regular basis - Saturday mornings once a month - we'd love you to join us! (email us on steyningorchard@gmail.com)

The orchard project has grown. At the far end of Nightingale Lane, in the Rifle Range at the foot of the Downs, an orchard has been created in partnership with the Steyning Downland Scheme (SDS).

The soil is good, the trees are growing fast - in addition it is a dog free area so small children can play, for families to picnic, where walkers can rest, and a venue where the Beavers and Woodcraft folk and other groups can gather. A third orchard has started to be planted in a corner of the Abbey Road

Village Green.




The Community Orchard in October 2014, after the first tree had been planted at our first Apple Day, and the positions for the next three trees marked out


The Community Orchard vibe is in the air! We have helped Bramber establish an orchard in the Bramber Brooks. Horsham District Council has recently bought this site and plan to develop it as a wildlife corridor and water meadow.

Other local communities including Henfield, Thakeham, Findon and Singleton have tapped into our experience when developing their own orchards.

So, while there is so much pessimism around locally, nationally and globally, in this tiny corner of the planet, environmental issues are being addressed vigorously with positive results.



Mongrel by Hanako Footman

Footnotes Press hardback £16.99

A compelling debut novel about love, loss, and identity from a fresh new voice in British-Asian fiction.

I was utterly gripped from the very first sentence of this heart-rending story

which weaves together 3 voices: Mei has grown up grieving the loss of her Japanese mother at the age of 6, and her yearning to fit in with her affluent suburban Surrey friends means that she suppresses both her Japanese heritage and her growing desire for her best friend Fran. We meet Yuki when she arrives in London to study violin, before she falls violently in love with her much older teacher and finds herself pregnant. After losing her mother in her early teens, Haruka goes off the rails and leaves her grandparent's farm for the bright lights of Tokyo, always mourning the loss of her secretive mother, who left so many unanswered questions... Gradually the stories ABI ELPHINSTONE intersect, and we unravel the tangled web of deception that connects them. Vivid and visceral writing.



Old God's Time by **Sebastian Barry**

Faber paperback £9.99 Now into paperback, this is an intense, haunting novel by one of our favourite Irish writers.

Tom Kettle is a retired policeman, widowed and living alone, spending his days staring out to sea. His solitude is interrupted

when two former colleagues turn up at his door to ask about a traumatic, decades-old case, and stir up long-buried memories. Tom is an unreliable narrator, slipping into dementia, and his narrative meanders

between past and present, gradually revealing his harrowing story. Sublime writing - poetic, poignant and powerful.



The Hours Before Dawn by Celia Fremlin Faber £9.99

We've been enjoying these Faber re-releases of Celia Fremlin's 1960's psychological thrillers, she certainly lives up to her moniker as Britain's answer to Patricia Highsmith. THAT NEVER ENDS Louise would give anything - anything - for a good

night's sleep. If the baby would just stop crying, everything would be fine. Or would it? What if Louise's growing fears about the family's new lodger, who seems to share all her husband's interests, are real? What could she do, and would anyone even believe her? Maybe, if she could get just get some rest, she'd be able to think straight . . . Witty, suspenseful, and deliciously sinister, it is a joy to discover these forgotten classics!

Saving Neverland by Abi Elphinstone. Puffin books £7.99























Skiing Survival Hints and Tips

Every year thousands of people hit the slopes to enjoy the fresh air, beautiful scenery and an active holiday. Although lots of fun, skiing can be tough on the body. We see quite a few skiing related injuries in our clinic each year. So, to help you stay safe this ski season and get the most amount of time on the slopes, here are some simple hints and tips to follow:



Preparation is key!

Many people will spend the early winter months in hibernation or glued to their desk at work and then head off on a skiing holiday expecting their bodies to cope with the stresses and strains of the activity. Whilst we aren't suggesting you need to be in the gym, a light training programme before you go will be really helpful.

- Go walking get your body moving on long walks to improve cardiovascular fitness and reduce stiffness.
- Squats a few squats every evening will waken up and build strength in the muscles used for skiing.
- Balance apparently in skiing, balance is quite important(!!) Improve your balance by practicing standing on one leg, aim for a minute on each side. Make it harder by standing on a cushion or closing your eyes.

On the slopes:

- Warm up start slowly to allow your body to warm up to the activity, even if you are a pro the likelihood is you haven't skied for a while so build up the intensity gently.
- Stretching end every session on the slopes with some gentle stretches to ease the tension in the muscles you have been working (target the thighs, hamstrings, buttocks and lower back). This will reduce stiffness in the muscles allowing you to start fresh every day.
- Take a break overexertion will most likely lead to injury. Listen to your body, if it feels tired or pain, stop!
- Stay hydrated -skiing is a very physical activity, your body will need to be kept well hydrated so drink plenty of water and steer clear of alcoholic drinks.
- Stay warm make sure you are wearing appropriate clothing; your muscles work better when they are warm.
- Get the right boots having a correctly

fitted ski boots will affect the comfort and performance of your skiing dramatically.

 ICE – for acute injuries use ice rather than heat as soon as possible to reduce the swelling.

Apres Ski:

You may be surprised to hear that quite a few issues that present to us in the clinic occur off the slopes, here are a few things to look out for....

- Carrying equipment skis and boots can be heavy and cumbersome, carrying them awkwardly can cause sprains and strains. Ensure that the weight is evenly distributed side to side and get help if it is too much.
- Tread carefully slips and falls often happen on ice in the resort, wear good lace up shoes with deep tread to give you more grip when out and about.
- Sleep sleep is essential for good recovery after a long day skiing so if the bed doesn't suit you it can often aggravate your back or neck. Some simple stretches last thing at night and first thing in the morning can help to reduce the tension that will build in the body from an uncomfortable bed.

Mark adds: 'Prevention is still better than cure and these tips can help you avoid injuries because just one joint or muscle out of line can be a disaster when you are travelling at 40 miles per hour'.

A New Year MOT and getting aches and pains checked out before you head to the slopes is always advisable.

Toad-in-the-hole



Once upon a time, the British people were divided. Impassioned debates raged throughout the land, truth and common sense became distorted, and the public rose up and demanded an answer. How did that toad get inside that rock?

In 1898, two burly workmen in a chalk quarry near Lewes cracked open a hollow chunk of flint. The solid rock, formed 85 million years ago, split open to reveal an airtight cavity at its core. To the quarrymen's amazement, entombed within the ancient flint was a dead toad.

'Toad-in-the-hole' hysteria soon hit the headlines. It seemed like every month the newspapers reported how someone had split open a rock and found a toad inside. Some of these toads had already croaked but others would inexplicably still be alive and hopping. The Victorian world was thrown into theological and philosophical panic. Clergymen preached that the Creator had placed the eternal amphibians in rocks at the dawn of time. Subscribers to Darwin's new theory of evolution were perplexed. Charles Dickens wrote of his bewilderment, while others believed it was simply sorcery. Scientists began burying living toads in sealed boxes to investigate the unfortunate animal's longevity.

The Lewes toad of 1898 is the world's only surviving artefact of the entombed toad craze. It now resides in Brighton's incredible Booth Museum of Natural History – one of my favourite places in the whole world. Amongst the many awe-inspiring exhibits at The Booth, you'll find a special cabinet dedicated



to curiosities. In it, lying reverentially on a bed of maroon felt, there is 'Probably the most famous toad in the world'. Admittedly when it comes to world-famous toads it's not a particularly crowded field, with only Toad of Toad Hall to contest the title. Alongside the original oval of cleft flint sits the shrivelled body of the infamous amphibian. The whole surreal exhibit is like a Kinder Surprise designed by Hieronymus Bosch.

But this cracked up flint isn't all it's cracked up to be. The Lewes toad was originally presented to the Brighton and Hove Natural History and Philosophical Society by Charles Dawson. That's the same Charles Dawson who would soon be sticking some Orangutan teeth on a human skull and declaring he had discovered the 'missing link' at Piltdown, near Uckfield.

In 1953, Dawson would be unmasked as a fraudster and the whole 'toad-in-the-hole' phenomenon would come crashing down, dismissed as poppycock.

We are so pleased that some of you are supporting us when planting your own hedges now and taking the advice from our website about suitable mixes of hedging to plant to help our endangered species, not a mono-culture.

All these hedges are so vital at this time of year to provide food for our poor birds trying to survive the wet and cold weather that we are experiencing. A winter buffet of berries, Hawthorn, Elder, Blackthorn, Dog Rose, Crab Apple, Holly, Hazel, and Ivy plus any fallen apples you still have, the blackbirds so enjoy them, all helps to keep them going when food

is so scarce. Do remember to crack the ice when it freezes, they need access to water.



We want to help our birds and mammals to make it through to spring and the breeding season in good health, if we are going to stop the terrible decline in biodiversity - so many endangered species that need our help.

Do remember the help that trees also give to humans, reducing stress. There is an article in Good Housekeeping - not our usual source, about Forest bathing - walking among trees We are all so lucky here in lovely Steyning to have access to Woodland. Not so for many who live in built up areas with no trees. This is all about connecting with nature via your senses.

Research has revealed this stress-easing activity can boost immunity, lower blood pressure and reduce stress, thanks to phytoncides compounds released by trees that reduce our stress hormone levels.

Find a forest or wood - Silence your phone - take a deep breath and walk slowly into the trees opening all your senses to sounds, smells and touching new textures. Sit with your back against a tree and be still for 15 minutes. Notice your breathing, everything around you and the leafy canopy above.

Walk out of the trees and check in with yourself to see how you feel. Hopefully calmer, more relaxed, less anxious. Repeat as often as you can - it's step by step medicine for the soul.

Trees are amazing in what they do for us!

STOP PRESS.

After talks with Richard Goring he has asked SFT to help with the Estate's plan to plant 1 km of hedge on higher ground to help reduce flooding at the west end of Steyning as it matures. This will also greatly increase biodiversity. Richard has also commissioned a consultant on additional methods to control flooding.



February Gardening Journal

February is a time for new beginnings and a time to reflect on the past year with the best place to view the garden from the comfort of an armchair with a cup of tea to hand. But when it's mild, it's a great time to sharpen up the structure of the garden, as the soil is easily workable. The winter sunshine and crisp frosty mornings also bring an added dimension too. Many perennials and ornamental grasses look really good when covered with the silvery hand of Jack Frost, the seed heads given a new and interesting lease of life.

There are a few plants that help us through the winter gloom with both Sarcococcas and Daphne being the most well known among them. With their decorative evergreen foliage, vibrant perfume and beautiful little flowers Daphnes, in particular, provide fantastic structure in the winter garden. They also compliment the early flowers of the spring bulbs really well too - especially the pure white of snowdrops. They provide great structure and often the foliage of Dapnhe's look great on their own, without any flower, all through the seasons.

Originating from the eastern Himalayas, Daphne bholua forms an upright growing evergreen shrub adorned with leathery mid-green oval leaves. Daphne bholua 'Jacqueline Postill' produces clusters of incredibly pretty, intensely fragranced flowers that are pink on the outside and white within. This makes it an ideal shrub for any garden because of it's slow growing habit and flowers that are present in the late winter, when most other plants are dormant.

The clusters of these wonderfully scented flowers open from late February and are followed by small purplish-black berries. It's best to keep pruning to a minimum, and plant where its roots will be shaded. They also don't like being moved when established so best to choose its home carefully so you don't have to disturb it again when its happily growing in your garden.

Grow Daphne bholua 'Jacqueline Postill' in fertile, moist but well-drained soil in partial shade. They are fabulous little shrubs and can be used in so many different types of schemes, its versatility making it very popular in both domestic and commercial planting schemes. They look best planted in repetition throughout a large garden and can also be used as single specimens in smaller schemes too

Daphnes are a must have for the winter border and can look great planted with a groundcover of cyclamen, or near a gate or doorway where the scent can be appreciated. However, be aware that all parts of the plant are toxic if eaten, and the sap

- Cornus (Dogwood) to low buds.
- If snow falls do not let the snow sit on the shrubs, gently shake off to prevent damage.
- · Prune Roses creating an open outward facing framework.
- Prune Clematis (late/summer flowering).
- Shape borders to neaten edges.
- In late February cutback deciduous grasses
- · Remove weeds from borders.
- · Prune out dead; diseased or damaged wood from trees and shrubs.
- · Complete pruning of Apple/fruit trees if not already done.
- · Mulch borders if not already done in Autumn - taking care of emerging bulbs.
- · Cut back Hydrangea Preziosa to first healthy buds on stems.

- Cut back Hydrangea Annabelle to a half/third to retain compact shape.
- Cut back side shoots of wisteria, pruning to two to three buds.
- Plant new climbers such as clematis/ honevsuckle
- · Prune summer flowering deciduous shrubs that flower on the current years growth - e.g. Buddleja, lavatera etc.
- · Sow hardy annuals for summer colour.

Vegetable Garden:

- Buy seed potatoes and chit tubers placing them eye end up in trays or egg boxes in a light, cool, frost free place.
- · Sow crops like broad beans, lettuce etc and place in greenhouses or coldframes for an earlier harvest.
- · Now's the time if you want to think about planting asparagus - keep weed free and mulch with a thick layer of organic matter.
- · Apply general fertiliser like growmore/blood fish and bone to beds.
- Mulch tree and cane fruit after pruning.
- · Plant garlic.
- · Spray dormant fruit bushes with plant oil based winter wash to kill overwintering eggs or aphid pests.

Some Steyning Streets

If we want to find our way around Steyning we know, or could look up on our phones, where to find particular streets. If, however, we were thrown back in time we would have some difficulties. Where, for instance, were the rather ordinary sounding Middyllane or Lyttyllane? Middle Lane which ran from the vill (the centre of the town) to the Church is straightforward; it was Church Street. But there must have been several little lanes five hundred or more years ago and this specific Lyttyllane we cannot place

Some name changes are actually Steyning men and boys practiced their archery, which we now call Shooting Field, used to be known as 'The Howe'.

Others are lent a level of confusion either because of a relaxed approach to how they were spelt or because of difficulties in reading the medieval script. So Cobstrete, Coprestret and Cokstrete were quite likely to have all been the same lane but the variation in the spelling opened the door for speculation about its modern equivalent. Because all the names began with the letters 'Co', Coxham Lane became the favoured equivalent. But that would seem to be wrong.

In a court hearing in 1478 Cobstrete was reported to be 'in a very bad state and a day is given for it to be repaired'. The Court then became very specific as to who was responsible for its repair. On the one

Stevning, who at one time or another was the ale taster and the bailiff for the Borough. On the other was 'the Tithing of Charleton' with instructions being given for the street to be repaired 'in

accordance

with the custom of the Borough from which documented so we know that the field where it runs (namely, Steyning) through the Tithing of Charleton, of which a day is given as much to the Tithing of Charleton for its part as to John Arnold for his part to repair it before the next View (the court of the 'View of Frankpledge)'. So Cobstrete was a road needing repair and maintenance by both Stevning and Charlton – and there is really only one road which could, at that time, have been identified as a 'street' and which ran between the two. That was what we now call Mouse Lane – then the route into Steyning from the west. There is no sign on early maps or records of any road or lane anywhere near Coxham Lane.

> It is also telling that William Pellett, who lived at Charlton Court, was arraigned by the court on nine different occasions for failing to undertake repairs to Cobstrete. Moreover, twenty five years later, the same road seems to have been in need of repair again when

> > for 'the mending of the way between the forge and Charlton and Oxonbroke and between the forge and the great Barn 60 cartloads of stone'.

The exact interpretation of this is uncertain



but 'the forge' may be that which lay not far from the present day Star Inn and 'the great barn' was probably the large barn at Charlton Court.

By 1597 the name Cobstrete had disappeared from Steyning's topography and the lane had become known as Mowze Lane. If the name Cobstrete was descriptive of a road along which cobnut trees or hazels grew, then Mouse Lane could have acquired its name descriptively as well. John Goring told Janet Pennington that you only had to look up the lane with its overarching trees to think of a large mousehole or rathole, though others have pointed out that waggons loaded with grain on their way to Court Mill probably shed enough of their loads to allow rats and mice to thrive.

However that might be, those who make regular use of this lane will not be in the least surprised to discover that the water racing down the lane after heavy rain lead to the need for its frequent repair in past centuries.
