2023 Climate Action Tracker: Take part in the survey




For the second year in a row, Greening Steyning,

Bramber & Beeding are running an online survey to find out what steps people are taking locally to cut their carbon footprints and help tackle climate change. We want to find out what's really happening out there as people adjust to rising energy bills, and growing worries about a warming planet.

It should only take 5 minutes to fill out. The first section asks what actions you took in 2022: so how did your New Year's resolutions pan out? The second asks what plans you have in store for 2023. There's 16 actions to choose from, but you can add others if they are not on the list.

120 households took part in the Tracker Survey last time. Top of the list of actions taken was encouraging wildlife in my garden, shopping locally more often, and doing more repairing, reusing and recycling. But 4 homes had fitted heat pumps, 8 had installed solar panels, and 8 has got an electric vehicle.

Perhaps you took up the challenge of 'No Mow May' and left the lawnmower in the shed and let the grass grow, along with those dandelions whose bright yellow flowers provide that important early nectar for bees.

Maybe you went further than that and decided to leave an area uncut for the rest of the summer, providing a home and food for the year for a myriad of important insects that pollinate plants. Or did you create a 'wildflower meadow' within your garden. Were you one of the lucky ones who discovered orchids popping up out of nowhere in your lawn?

Were you ambitious and created a pond for wildlife? Did you make a woodpile in a shady corner for all manner of creepy crawlies to live in?

Was the hedge allowed to grow wilder for nesting birds. Were the berries left on the bushes in the autumn and are the remains of the windfalls from the apple tree still rotting beneath it, food for blackbirds and thrushes in the Autumn and snacks for slugs and snails, fungus, and hundreds of tiny, microscopic creatures over the winter?

Gardens have a really important role to play in the fight to reverse the desperate decline in biodiversity over the last seventy years.

Greening Steyning has been promoting wildlife gardening since we conducted a survey back in 2020 on people's gardening habitats. This year, we want to raise awareness of how important it is that we all do a little bit towards making our gardens havens for a whole raft of wildlife.

We approached Steyning in Bloom to ask them if they would provide us with an opportunity to include a group of 'wildlife friendly' gardens in their annual Open Garden Day at the end of June 2023. And they have said YES!

So now we are looking for gardeners who are proud of their wildlife friendly gardens and brave enough to share them with others.

Size doesn't matter. This is all about sharing ideas and encouraging others who may be thinking about 'wilding' their gardens or maybe opening the eyes of those who would never dream of changing their habits.

And the important thing is that you don't have to worry about the weeds coming up in the

By the end of this year we should have at least 80 trees planted on verges with the support and donations of the community. Here We Come A-Wassailing

Saturday 21st January. 2023. January; grey, cold, wet, drear. The magic of Christmas already a faded memory. New Year forgotten along with all those well-meaning resolutions.

As dusk gathers in Steyning High Street, one by one, the shops are closing for the night. Lights go out. Darkness sidles into the corners of the bus shelter by the car park. The pavements, wet and shiny with rain, are empty.

January; dark, cold, wet, miserable. But wait, there is something in the air; a tingle of excitement, the sound of voices, movement, laughter, shadows gathering, people making their way up the high street, along Charlton Street, heading for the Memorial Playing Field. A crowd has collected outside the Cricket Club. Some are carrying pots and pans, whistles tucked in coat pockets. Wrapped up against the chill in the air, excited youngsters, parents, old and young are waiting.

A small huddled group stands apart; shadowy blackened faces, and strange dark tatter jackets. Mythago Morris dancers. They stand and wait watching the crowd grow larger.

At the top of the Playing Field, the orchard, wrapped in night, is also waiting. Fruit trees, bare branches spread across the darkened sky, stand listening, around a gnarled ancient tree which is garlanded in lights.

They are all waiting because tonight is special. Really special.





STEYNING COMMUNITY ORCHARD

After a break of two years, because of Covid, Steyning Community Orchard, is once again celebrating its annual Wassail. It is time again to take part in a ritual that has come down the ages to us, which has its roots deep within the soil and bonds us to the natural world around us, as it has bound those before us.

The word Wassail comes from the Anglo-Saxon greeting 'Waes hael' means 'be hale', 'be in good health'. For hundreds of years, people have gathered to go Orchard Wassailing on the eve of Twelfth Night, to rouse their winter fruit trees into life with chanting and singing; beating the trees with sticks to wake them, praising the trees for past harvests and exhorting them to 'be hale' for the coming season and harvest.

At last, the wait is over; Mythago welcome the gathering, and open the evening's celebration with music and dancing and gently lead young and old up to the orchard and around the chosen tree festooned in lights. Then the fun begins as the tree is woken from its winter slumber with chanting, music, dancing, the stamping of feet, the banging of pans and the blowing of whistles. Any evil spirits dwelling within the tree are chased away. Then everyone makes an offering to the tree; a slice of toast dipped in

a specially prepared Wassail bowl filled with mead, crab apples, sugar, spices and egg, laid at the foot of the tree, a token of thanks for the fruit it has borne the previous year and a gift to the tree spirit living within it.

Then with a final roar of noise, the celebration draws to a close and people drift back to the warmth of their homes carrying with them the memory of something special that lit up a dark, wet, cold January evening.

Join us for this year's special family Wassail, wake up the orchard and look forward from the depths of dark January to a new year full of light and life.

If you would like to talk to the Wardens in person on any issues you have in your community, they are holding a series of drop in sessions throughout January at The Hub, 19 Church Lane, Upper Beeding, Steyning BN44 3HP on the following dates:

Wednesday 4 January10.30am - 12pmTuesday 10 January2pm - 4pmWednesday 11 January10.30am -12.30amTuesday 17 January2pm - 4pmTuesday 24 January2pm - 4pmTuesday 31 January2pm - 4pm

Based within the community, our wardens work alongside partner agencies to improve the quality of life for everyone and promote community cohesion and resilience.

The wardens can help:

- Provide a reassuring, uniformed patrolling presence.
- Provide an efficient eyes and ears service aimed at reducing fear of crime and improving the quality of life.
- Deal with environmental crime issues, notably dog fouling and littering.
- Reduce incidents of criminal damage and antisocial behaviour.
- Encourage the establishment of activities for young people.
- Support vulnerable members of the community by preventing isolation.
- Work in partnership with other agencies to help benefit the community.
- Work in close partnership with and are accredited by West Sussex Police.

The wardens are not:

- A replacement for the police.
- An emergency service or response team
- A 24/7 service. There will be times when no wardens are on duty.
- A care service. The neighbourhood
- wardens are able to signpost elderly and vulnerable people to relevant agencies.
- Parking wardens. The neighbourhood
 - wardens cannot issue parking tickets.



Great Spotted Woodpecker

Wildlife Trust

My New Year's resolution is to try and be more positive about the future - but I already feel like banging my head repeatedly against a tree. Standing out in the street this morning, I heard a noise that reassured me that I'm not alone.

The drumming of the Great Spotted Woodpecker is a familiar sound throughout February, surely earning this striking black and white bird the reputation as one of Britain's most famous drummers along with Ringo Starr and Phil Collins.

The bird's drumming serves an important function because the Great Spotted Woodpecker realises it can't sing and doesn't attempt to. Sadly, the same can't be said for Ringo Starr and Phil Collins. Instead, its drumroll is a percussive proclamation that hammers home the message to other male woodpeckers to stay away from its territory in the treetops. It also serves to drum up support from female woodpeckers in the vicinity who may be looking for a pied partner.

This 'song' may not be as sweet as the melodies sung by the Robin or Blackbird but it still gets its message across. Indeed, the drumming can



carry the bird's message across half a mile of countryside, with a male broadcasting up to 600 drumrolls a day. Each drumroll consists of up to 10-16 beats, typically in a one second burst.

Of course, if I did attempt to take my frustrations out on a tree in a similar way, I'd suffer some form of concussion - but woodpeckers are specially designed to avoid this by having shock absorbent tissue between the base of their bill and their strengthened skulls to cushion the impact.

Their incredible beak is more than just a drumstick, it's also a pickaxe which allows them to chip away at trunks to excavate their own nest hole; and a chisel with which the woodpecker prises open tree bark to find food. That mighty beak is a formidable weapon too, which sends other birds on the peanut feeder scarpering pretty sharpish.

And Great Spotted Woodpeckers are becoming more greatly spotted, as it is a British bird which is actually increasing in numbers. The pecker's population leapt in the seventies and nineties, with some estimates stating they have increased by 300% over the past five decades. The availability of dead wood thanks to Dutch Elm Disease and the availability of peanuts thanks to British bird lovers being among of the reasons for this increase.

See, I ended the article on a positive note, maybe I won't break my New Year's resolution after all. Well done to me, I'm feeling upbeat about the future. Now to put the kettle on, put my feet up, and turn on the news...

Will it be a happy new year?

As I write this, the Bank of England have announced yet another interest rate rise the ninth in the last year.

However, for interest rates not directly linked to the base rate (like trackers) rates have gradually been decreasing something the mainstream press seem to have forgotten to report!

Since the chaotic period of Liz Truss' reign and the spike in rates, there have been three mortgage interest rate reductions!

This has brought fixed rates down to the mid 4% range from the height of around 6%. Still higher than we'd all like but a significant improvement.

So, with the easing of rates for the time being, what else is on the horizon for those with mortgages or looking to take one out in 2023?

Well, with the closure of Help to Buy which allowed people to purchase properties that may not have been available had there not been the deposit incentive from the Government some lenders, Nationwide being one, have developed a product to try to fill this void called the Deposit unlock scheme.

This requires a minimum 5% deposit for a new build property and is available to first time buyers and subsequent movers.

Normally at this high loan to value there is a requirement for an indemnity fee to be paid (a type of insurance to protect against negative equity) but this is waived in these cases.


There are also incentives out there for "greener" homes, cash backs for first time buyers and another scheme called First Homes introduced by the Government to assist first time buyers to purchase a new build home at a large discount.

The mortgage market rarely sits still so one

would expect announcements next year on how banks and building societies aim to stimulate the mortgage market.

Love to Move in the Steyning Centre every Tuesday

"An hour and a half of Wonderfulness Each Week" Promoting brain function by getting older adults moving & grooving!

Love to Move is a new and exciting age and dementia friendly exercise to music programme launched this September in the Steyning Centre in Fletchers Croft. The programme is there to support everyone in the community and is set up and fully funded by a local domiciliary care company, Right at Home. The class is run by the wonderfully vibrant Cherry Tolcher and Anna Shaw from the British Gymnastics Foundation. Supported by Sport England, the programme has been a great success since launching. With help from the Steyning Parish Council and Sport England, Right at Home worked with Cherry and Anna to get everything up and running.

Why try Love to Move?

Love to Move is a programme specially designed to get older people moving and functioning better. As well as this, there are so many other benefits of the programme helping to improve the lives of people living with dementia:

- Social Interaction the fun and enjoyment of Love to Move makes the programme really effective. The exercises are enjoyable to do and encourage conversation.
- Memory stimulation trying the exercises in time to your favourite music can help to stimulate memory and recall in people living with dementia.
- Use of foundation gymnastics skills the movements used during Love to Move exercises help to develop coordination, balance, core strength and flexibility to name just a few of the many benefits.

History of Love to Move

In 2014 The British Gymnastics Foundation began working with experts in Japan who deliver their own age and dementia friendly gymnastics programme. The Japanese programme has been so successful that it is now completely state funded, taking place in every care home across Japan. Research published in 2016 on the original Japanese programme concluded that it significantly improves walking speed. The programme has also been shown to:

- improve cognitive function.
- help reduce depression in participants.
- improve balance.
- improve the ability to undertake activities for daily living.

Two years ago, the Foundation began delivering Love to Move in multiple care homes and community settings in the UK. To date, the programme has been delivering life-changing outcomes for many participants. The Love to Move programme has helped some participants to use their hands again so they can feed themselves, do crafts, play bingo and socialise with friends and family. Vinal Karania, Research Manager from Age UK says 'It has a demonstrable benefit in the physical, emotional, and cognitive aspects of older people. Older people having mild to advanced forms of dementia appear to benefit the most'.

Refreshments and cakes are provided after the 1-hour programme allowing time to socialise giving attendees the opportunity to reconnect further in the local community. Initial reluctance to join may be encountered, but feedback from participants is overwhelmingly positive. Cherry Tolcher says 'most important is about having fun to the tunes of the 1950's and 1960's. You really see a difference in people's wellbeing as they leave the class uplifted'. Owner of Right at Home, Anton van Baalen says 'I am over the moon noticing the positive difference in people from one week to the next. Their confidence, ability to carry out the bilateral exercises, and happiness is a joy to see'.

Feel free to join the classes each Tuesday at 1.30pm. There is a small fee of £5 asked as a contribution to help a little towards the cost of the programme.

- Inform my patient immediately and honestly should any of their treatment not go as expected.
- Recommend the appropriate use of imaging and investigations, consistent with that clinically needed through evidence, and to avoid risk to my patient.



What's in a Watt?

The watt is named after the Scottish inventor James Watt. The unit name was proposed initially by C. William Siemens in August 1882 in his President's Address to the Fifty-Second Congress of the British Association for the Advancement of Science. Noting that units in the practical system of units were named after leading physicists, Siemens proposed that watt might be an appropriate name for a unit of power. Siemens defined the unit consistently within the then-existing system of practical units as 'the power conveyed by a current of an Ampère through the difference of potential of a Volt'. For more in depth information: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Watt

So what's in a watt? It is the amount of energy an item needs to function; the rate at which energy is consumed. One watt is equivalent to electricity flowing at a rate of one joule (unit of energy) per second.

How do you calculate watts?

Equation: Amps x Volts = Watts

E.G.: 5 Amps x 220 Volts = 1100 Watts.

If one examiners the label on an electrical device it will usually advise that the device needs a certain voltage and will be a certain wattage.

E.G. Your electric kettle: 220 VAC - 2000 W.

Using the above equation as W/V = Athe kettle will require a supply that is able to deliver 9.09 Amps (note this excludes allowance for resistance of the connecting cable).

So what are Volts, Amps (Amperes) and Watts as these are all related.

Volts: A common analogy used to describe volts is a garden hose where voltage is the water pressure or force in the hose that causes the water to flow. Volts are a measure of how much force each electron is under, which is called 'potential.' Potential is what causes electricity to flow. Thus volts measure the *pressure* causing them to flow.

Amps: measure the flow of electricity as an electric current. Using the garden hose analogy to describe how amps work can be

compared to the volume of water flowing through the hose. More water flowing through the hose per minute, the stronger the current. Specifically, they measure the amount of electrons that flow past a certain point per second. Thus the difference between volts and amps is that amps measure the *volume* of electrons flowing past a certain point per second and if this increases, so do the amps.

Watts: Amps x volts = Watts which is a measurement of the amount of energy being *released*. Using the garden hose analogy, this would be the amount of water flowing. The higher the wattage, which we now know is the combination of electrical potential and flow, the more power and output we'll see. For example, the greater the wattage rating of a microwave the faster it will cook the food.

How does this relate in practice?

Electrical power sold to a user is measured in units. Each unit = one kwh (1000w for 1 hour).

10 × 100w globes will use one kwh or 1 unit if they are all ON for 1 hour.

Therefore to reduce the cost of electrical power used, one needs to be careful not to have any devices **ON** that are NOT needed EVEN if this is just a low wattage device because the cumulative effect of all the 'low' wattage devices (like 'dripping taps') being ON will result in paying money needlessly for your electricity.

With their vibrantly coloured stems they provide fantastic structure in winter gardens and also contrast with early bulbs, especially the pure white of snowdrops. Later in the year, if left to flower, the large white bracts provide colour in the summer garden too.

Cornus is a large and varied genus, made up of 65 species of mainly deciduous shrubs and small trees. C. alba, C. sericea and C. sanguinea are the main producers of the coloured stemmed varieties.

Not all Cornus are known for the their Stem colour, some are known for their unusual flowers in mid summer, eg Cornus kousa and others for their interesting branch formations, eg Cornus Controversa.

It's a varied group of trees and shrubs, all have their own merits but as its winter see below for some suggestions on how to bring a little bit of sunshine in the depths of winter.

Cornus alba Elegantissima is probably my favourite and I use it a lot – its variegated leave are useful as a backdrop to summer flowering

berries making 'Bud's Yellow' a plant for many seasons.

Cornus alba 'Kesselringii' has dramatic, dark stems which provides an excellent focal point in the winter garden. Tolerating a range of conditions including partial shade, it contrasts well with yellow-olive or red-stemmed varieties of dogwood.

Cornus are best grown in rich soils in full sun to part shade. It is tolerant of a wide range of different soil types but prefers a bit of moisture. The best stem colour occurs on young stems and although pruning is not required, if you want to make the best of that winter display, it is advisable to prune at least once every couple of years. Pruning can include removing 20-25% of the oldest stems in early spring of each year to stimulate growth of new stems or can be as savage as pruning right down to the ground on an annual basis.

These fabulous little shrubs can be used in so many different types of schemes, its versatility making it very popular in both domestic and commercial planting schemes. They look best planted in groups in front of a dark background but can be used as a single specimen in smaller schemes too.

One of my favourite combinations include Geranium Patricia planted in front of the Cornus alba Elegantissima. The stems of the geranium climb into the Cornus with the flowers poking out form the leafy structure. When the herbaceous then dies down in the winter, the cornus comes alive and ensures that you still have some interest in the garden during those grey gloomy days too.

Jobs to be done in January: Ornamental Garden.

- If the ground is waterlogged then keep off the soil to avoid compaction and worsening the conditions.
- If snow falls Do not let the snow sit on the shrubs, gently shake off to prevent damage.
- Prune bush or standard apples and pears, aiming to create an open framework of about 5 main branches.
- Sweet Peas can be sown this month and those sown in the autumn can be potted on. Place them in a sunny greenhouse, coldframe or windowsill.
- Plan annual cut flowers for the borders.
- Mulch borders if not already done in autumn.
- Plant deciduous hedges.
- Move deciduous trees and shrubs if necessary.
- Ensure protective coverings such as fleece/ mulch have remained in place over frost tender plants.
- Avoid walking on turf when the grass is covered with frost or is waterlogged.

Vegetable Garden.

- Protect brassicas from pigeons with cloches, netting or fleece.
- Harvest Winter Vegetables such as parsnip, swede, sprouts, leeks and turnip.
- Remove one third of the oldest stems of black currants at ground level to encourage new basal shoots.

Fabrics, Hats and Furbelows

In recent issues of Your Steyning our articles have touched on the leather workers, the shoemakers and candle makers of Steyning and how people might have shopped for their groceries in the past. But they were not the only things people needed: they also needed clothes and, very often, hats.

Many a Steyning housewife will have made the family's clothes but some tasks were difficult to tackle and, as time went by, they came to rely more on seamstresses and tailors. Indeed, by 1791, there were four tailors in the town. They needed little in the way of 'tools of the trade' and were each of them living in quite small houses in the town. Various earlier inventories of Steyning tailors confirm this picture: rolls of cloth and smoothing irons were mentioned but not much else

However, it continued to be a respectable trade and, towards the end of the 19th century, Richard Skinner, a master tailor, could be seen sitting cross-legged in the window of 25 High Street, along with his two assistants, whilst working on his tailoring. It was Richard's son or grandson who discovered Steyning's cavalier's hat whilst larking about at the top of the house. This was the hat which was eventually deposited with Bristol Museum and which, during the war, sank to the bottom of the Atlantic - the

ship, which was carrying it 'to safety', having been torpedoed.

Perhaps this hat was one of those made by Thomas Temple. When he died in 1670 he had 169 hat blocks to cater for different sizes and styles, 'one tub to hold dye liquer, a stiffening block, a vat, two stampers and twenty two pounds of wool', along with 'two new hats, a hat band and seven hats drest'.

We know that 120 years after Thomas's death, hats were still being made in Steyning. At that time James Jenner was the hatter; he lived and had his workshop where the Truffles café is now. The hats he made would, of course, have been to a rather different style from Thomas Temple's, even if the tools of his trade were largely unchanged.

Hats were also on Samuel Lucke's inventory in 1706 - he had 'capps of knitt yarne, bonnets and straw hats' plus a box of hat bands and another head covering - a 'huke' – which was apparently a long veil



reaching to the knees. Hats, however, were only a small part of Samuel's inventory. In his Steyning shop (where the post office is now) he stocked 123 different fabrics, both plain and coloured, made from many different stomacher being a diamond shaped garment, combinations of varn - wool, worsted, cotton, flax, silk and even horsehair - using a wide variety of weaves and finishes. He had 4,500 vards of fabric in the Steyning shop and another 2,000 yards at Shoreham.

Some of the fabrics such as Dowlas and Cantaloon have largely dropped out of use but the names of others are still evocative: swan skin, for instance, was (and is) a soft compacted flannel.

It was an impressive selection and suggests that Steyning women were discriminating and knowledgeable shoppers when looking for material for clothing or for furnishing, or indeed for ribbons, for gartering, for buttons and for lace. Samuel did not only cater for those who made their own clothes. For good

measure he also sold 'printed petty coates and yellow wastcoates', together with 'hose' for men, women and children and 'bodyes' (bodices) together with 'stomachers' - a often using patterned or embroidered material, which decorously covered the cleavage under the laced bodice. To make sure that he could deal with almost any eventuality he also had on his shelves some clogs and pattens for when the roads became too muddy, three gallons of French brandy for almost any occasion and a box of shrouds.

It would seem as if there were few of the necessities or elegancies of life - or of death - which a Steyning household could not obtain within the town, all those years ago.




