Steyning in Bloom

Gardens are awakening after a hard wet winter - it's the thrilling time of year where we start to plan for the year ahead. Happily we are starting to see the green shoots of tulips peeping through the soil in the tubs in the High Street to take over from our sadly frost ravaged wallfowers.

Steyning in Bloom have been planning *The Garden Tour* for the past two years and has been a huge success. This year it will be bigger and better. We will be able to visit around 20 gardens

This will include 5 gardens chosen by the 10/10 Greening group with an emphasis on re-wilding. We are all now becoming aware of the need to encourage wildlife - corridors through towns and countryside, insect friendly plants, water conservation, no-mow May. It will be fascinating to see and to hear how people are pushing forward these ideas.

The times for the Open Gardens are 12:00 -17:30 on Sunday June 25th. Several visitors have asked for there could be longer opening times, so they could visit more gardens. This year we'll be starting the tour earlier, and there will be an opportunity for a simple lunch, as well as tea and cake at various venues as before. It's been decided that gardens we've visited for two years will not be in the tour so there will be plenty of new surprises. Please put the date in your diary and alert your friends.

Steyning gardeners are enthusiastic and creative. For many years we've had a

competition for the best front

gardens and some amazing winners, but have now decided to change the formula to give everyone a chance to compete.

Our team will be keeping an eye out for the best hanging baskets and awarding prizes for the winners, so get planting and make sure you display is visible from the road!

As always, fund raising is there at the top of the to do list - plant sales has emerged for us as a really useful money raiser, and a happy way of sharing plants likely to do well in our soil. This year we've all had losses due to strange weather conditions and need new plants to fill the empty spaces - so if you felt like putting some out for sale in aid of Steyning in Bloom your contribution would be SO welcome!

As always we are grateful the the Parish Council and to the Steyning Business Chamber for their support.

Steyning Community Orchard: Our Wassail returns!



After a gap of 3 years (due to Covid), and on a cold, clear winter's **STEYNING COMMUNITY** evening in January we were finally able to invite Mythago Morris **ORCHARD** back to lead our Wassail off the Memorial Playing Field (MPF) Orchard Dancing preceded the torch lit procession across to the candlelit orchard where the oldest tree had been decorated with lights, ribbons and tatters.



Over 150 people joined in the singing, chanting and blessing of the tree before placing cider-soaked bread in the branches as gifts to the birds and bees. The dance around the tree culminated in making as much noise as possible, with banging pots and pans, blowing whistles and generally yelling to chase the evil spirits away.

The evening finished with members of the Steering Group meeting up with Mythago in the Chequers pub in Steyning, where we were treated to an impromptu music and singing session. Thank you to everyone involved – Mythago (who have already been booked for next year), The Chequers, all the helpers and everyone who came along.

The Wassail begins another busy year for

the Steering group and volunteers, with our monthly work parties in one of the 3 orchards, as well as preparing and planting memorial trees, strimming in the Downland Orchard, The Steyning May Fair, Apple pressing in the Autumn.. and an important job this time of year – pruning the apple and pear trees.

The RHS states - 'apple and pear trees should be pruned every winter to keep them productive and control their size. An open centred crown helps the trees stay healthy and bear good quality fruit'. Pruning should take place between Nov – early March. For more details visit the RHS website rhs.org.uk or any reputable horticultural book.

There's an old saying that after pruning you should be able to throw your hat up through



the middle of the crown –although what type of hat was never specified!

Although we are preparing for the coming year's harvest, there's still stored fruit from last year available to eat.

Here is a recipe for Pear Flan we found in an Usborne children's cookery book, and have used for years

Ingredients:

5 pears 125g (4oz) butter 125g (4oz) flour 125g (4oz) caster sugar 3 eggs Pinch of salt A few drops vanilla essence

Method:

- Melt butter in a saucepan over a low heat.
- Beat together eggs and sugar. Stir in the butter, then the flour, a little at a time. Add the vanilla and salt.
- Peel the pears and cut into quarters. Take out cores and pips.
- · Grease an ovenproof flan dish. Pour a little

mixture into the dish. Put in the pears, then the rest of the mixture.

 Bake the flan - Oven setting 180C/350F/ Gas 4 -for 45 minutes to an hour until it is puffy and golden brown.



Henfield Theatre Company present The Farndale Avenue Housing Estate Townswomen's Guild Dramatic Society

No – not a new dramatic society in our midst! This is the full title of Henfield Theatre Company's production to be presented at The Henfield Hall on 23rd, 24th, and 25th March at 19:45, with a matinee on 25th March at 14:30. (The cast and crew are referring to the play simply as "Farndale".) In his first outing as Director, John Coit leads a cast of six from the Farndale Avenue Housing Estate Townswomen's Guild Dramatic Society in presenting an Agatha Christie-style ambitious evening's entertainment – a cunning whodunnit, "Murder at Checkmate Manor" in a 1930's drawing room. The cast of six cover all fourteen roles with hysterical results!

Every drama group has experienced the horrors of what can go wrong on opening night, and this production is no different - with the possible exception that almost everything that could happen, does! The scenery collapses, cues are missed, lines are forgotten, and the sound effects take on a strange note at times ... Utter mayhem! This play is written by David McGillivray and Walter Zerlin Jnr., who formed the touring theatre company Entertainment Machine in 1975. The following year their play The Farndale Macbeth was performed at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe to such acclaim that a further nine Farndale plays ensued. This one, the Murder Mystery, was first produced in Edinburgh in 1980 and was partly revised by the authors for a new tour in 1996.

Common Frog

Wildlife Trust

My friend Alf passed away a few years back. He loved Sussex and he loved wildlife but Alf's real passion was amphibians: newts, frogs and toads. Alf loved them so much his funeral service ended with that Paul McCartney Frog Chorus song.

That's commitment for you. I spent the rest of the week with that annoying 'bom-bombom-aye-e-aye' tune rolling 'round my head. I'm sure Alf was laughing somewhere. While I was helping Alf's family clear his house I was honoured to be given one of his prized possessions: a clock that chimes each hour by playing a variety of frog croaks. Long ago Alf's wife Iris had made him take the batteries out because it was unbearable.

But there was no silencing Alf's pond each spring. Each year it would come alive with the sound of a real frog chorus. Alf was proud of his pond. Creating a garden pond, no matter what size, is one of the best things you can do to help wildlife in your garden. If you're lucky, in March it will turn into a hotbed of activity as Common Frogs return to mate and lay their eggs. After spending the winter hidden away in the garden, it's time to go a-courting.

Approach the pond quietly with a torch and you can observe the mating frogs. Look closely and you may be able to identify the male frog (darker with a bluish tinge to his throat) and the female (white granulations on her flanks). But if you can't notice these features then the males are on top and the females are on the bottom. The lustful male will hop on the female and grasp her as tight as he can. He even develops special extra-grip pads on his forearms and he'll use those powerful back legs to boot off any rival males who try to muscle in. In theory, the males with the longest and loudest croaks are the most attractive, but with females sometimes outnumbered ten to one by males the pond party can get loud, chaotic and confusing.

Amorous male frogs will grasp anything: a log, a fish, even another male (males have a special croaking signal which politely informs other males there has been a misunderstanding)

Female Common Frogs can lay up to 4,000 eggs, although 1,000-2,000 is more normal. These are fertilised by the male as they emerge and form into those familiar clouds of jelly spawn.

So, in tribute to Alf I decide to restore his croaking clock to full working order. I reinstalled the batteries and nailed it proudly on my office wall. After two hours I turned it off. That croaking was unbearable! I'm still sure Alf was laughing somewhere.

The latest Bank of England rate rise made for an interesting week!

The Bank of England announced yet another base rate increase but in the week leading up to the announcement, lenders were reducing their fixed mortgage rates.

'A walk on the wild side in Steyning Parish'

An urban 'Rewilding' success story

Introduction

The Abbey Road Open Space is hidden away amongst the housing developments to the west of the A283 Steyning by-pass and is probably unknown to the majority of Steyning's residents. The site has been left largely unmanaged for the last 20+ years, apart from grass cutting and essential tree maintenance.

This has allowed the site to mature and develop to a point where it now needs some gentle attention to maintain what is there, whilst improving other areas that have become overgrown or swamped by more rampant growth.

Most people who see this site for the first time are surprised by how many different habitats are represented here, including a chalk stream, wet woodland, ditch, pond, meadow, hedgerow and scrub.

None are very extensive, but together they make up a valuable mix, that with some gentle management, has become an even more important biodiverse site in this part of Steyning.



What was the plan?

Abbey Road is owned by Steyning Parish Council and comprises 4.5 acres, divided by a residential road of the same name, and was designated a 'Village Green' in 2016. In February 2020, the Council agreed to follow a new Management Plan which had been largely conceived and compiled by Roger Brown, a local resident volunteer.

The plan was to make small but effective changes. The First change was to double the frequency of grass cutting on 'Abbey Road South' and begin to plant a Community Orchard to ensure this area became a more attractive family Recreational / Parkland facility, whilst reducing the cutting regime to the grassed area on 'Abbey Road North' to create a more diverse meadow. Also north east of the road, and as part of the rewilding process, the pond was to be deepened to ensure it was less likely to dry out in Summer; trees would be planted (12 last year alone); hazel deflectors installed in the stream to trap sediment and create some more varied flow in the channel: to create and maintain walkways around the site; to liaise with experts and agencies to ensure the correct practices are being followed; then to introduce some additional native fauna such as the 'Yellow Rattle' (pictured below - Yellow Rattle is semiparasitic on grass roots, reducing the grass's vigour and allowing other wildflowers to establish. Its nickname is 'The meadow maker')



Lastly, and. most importantly, to set up a local volunteer group of enthusiastic residents, with the parish councils support, to complete a series of monthly working parties to improve the habitats by completing a series of sympathetic conservation workdays.

What makes this village green so special? After two years there is tremendous progress, with the latest botany survey registering 110 different plant species. The bird surveys have reported Buzzards, Heron, Red Kite as well as the regular group of Steyning Swifts. The Bat Surveys report 4 different species; there are 11 different kinds of butterfly sighted and around the pond now reside water voles, slow worms, toads, frogs and above it flies three types of dragonflies.

The Abbey Road Volunteers now number 16 active members, led by Roger, without whom, this project would simply not have been the success it clearly is today. Indeed, on a summers day you might be lucky enough to enjoy some moments in his company, as he explains all that can be enjoyed by walking on the wild side at Abbey Road



Elbow Pain

Tennis elbow (aka Lateral epicondylitis) often gets in the way of doing the things you love. It can even affect the simplest of tasks like making a cup of tea.

You don't have to be a tennis player to suffer with tennis elbow! It is actually a misnomer as it occurs in roughly only five percent of people who play tennis. The cause of tennis elbow is down to repetitive strain of the forearm extensor muscles. Practically any occupation, sporting endeavour, or household activity that has repeated use of the forearm and wrist may lead to this condition. Certain activities and occupations are more commonly associated with tennis elbow, such as plumbing, painting, fishing, computer use, and playing certain musical instruments. Tennis elbow is most common in adults between the ages of 30 and 50 but can affect people of all ages.

Symptoms:

Tennis elbow causes pain from the elbow into the forearm and wrist, it is normally made worse when lifting or gripping things. The pain caused by tennis elbow will make the arm feel weak – so things like picking up a kettle, turning a doorknob, or even shaking hands can feel difficult.

Diagnosis:

In many cases, your chiropractor can diagnose tennis elbow (Lateral epicondylitis) simply by listening to you describe your symptoms, performing a physical examination, and learning about your lifestyle and activities. However, if they suspect other reasons like a pinched nerve, fracture, or arthritis are causing your pain, he/ she may refer for X-rays, Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI), or Electromyography (EMG).

Treatment:

Tennis elbow isn't going to disappear overnight – as a general rule it can take 4-6 weeks to resolve the problem. As with any condition, sometimes, it can be slow to respond initially but remember to persist and not get discouraged.





Step into the Climate Café

I wonder how many of you reading this article are struggling with life at the moment? We have lived through a pandemic and are now caught up in an economic crisis that is impacting on all our lives.

And we know there is another disaster in the wings, edging its way onto the stage. A much larger problem, bigger than anything we have been through in the last three years.

The Climate Crisis. It is no longer a distant smudge on the horizon. This is 2023 and the storm clouds are overhead and very real. People share experiences, swap stories, ideas, news, talk about the difficulties of being 'green'. It is not a fix-it forum. There is plenty of other advice about offsetting the problem of climate change from organizations like Greening Steyning already out there but ideas are exchanged, and we share useful resources, articles, books to read.

Climate change is the 'Elephant in the Room'. An issue which people are reticent about, unlikely to bring up in conversation, to share their feelings about. And many people desperately need to unburden themselves, to talk to others who feel the same as they do.

March Gardening Journal

Spring seems to be everyone's favourite times of year. New beginnings in the form of the spring bulbs and emerging blossom on our trees helps to wake us from our winter hibernation with a smile. Mother nature starts to wake from its winter slumber bringing with her longer and warmer days which are ideal for getting out in the garden. Don't be tempted to plant tender plants out too early though but make sure to make the best of the sunny spring days and sow those seeds, plant those plants, generally potter around getting your garden ready for the summer months to come.

If you were to say 'wallflowers' to most people, they'd think of the spring-flowering bedding plants - Erysimum cheiri for example. But there are also numerous short-lived perennial types that flower for several months in spring, summer and even well into autumn, such as the very popular Erysimum Bowles Mauve.

Erysimum Bowles Mauve provides a wealth of colour to beds, borders and containers, producing delightfully scented flowers. It's a bushy evergreen perennial growing up to 75/90cm, with narrow, dark grey-green leaves and erect racemes of beautiful mauve flowers about 2cm across. It was shortlisted for the Chelsea Plant of the Centenary for the decade 1973-1982 and it positively thrives in the gardens located around the South Downs National Park.

In fact, Erysimum is found in a range of habitats across the northern hemisphere and has developed diverse morphology and growth habits (herbaceous annual or perennial, and woody perennial). Different Erysimum species are used as food plants by the larvae of some butterflies and moth species. Many species of beetles, bugs and grasshoppers eat the leaves and stalks. Most wallflowers are pollinator-generalists, their flowers being visited by many different species of bees, bee flies, hoverflies, butterflies, beetles, and ants.

All wallflowers prefer to be grown in full sun but will tolerate light or dappled shade. For best results they prefer fertile soil enriched with lots of organic matter which holds plenty of moisture in spring and summer and doesn't dry out or become waterlogged. However, they will tolerate poorer soil too, and you could add a general or high potash granular feed to the soil before planting out.

To care for wallflowers: keep the soil or compost moist, especially when plants are flowering. Regular liquid feeds will help prolong the flowering period. After flowering, cut back perennial wallflowers to keep them

compact. This, along with liquid feeds, will also help encourage further flushes of flowers well into autumn.

Erysuimum Bowles mauve is a great little plant that works well on its own as a specimen in a pot. It also looks great in a mixed planting scheme and if mixed with the Orange of something like Geum Totally Tangterine of the Lime Green of Euphorbia you will get a striking contrasting combination that will provide a dramatic display in your borders or pot displays. While its not the most long lived perennial its definitely one that's worth including in the garden and will bring a little bit of something special providing colour and interest for months of the summer season.

Jobs to be done in March: Ornamental Garden:

- A general fertiliser could be applied over borders if felt necessary. If leaves look yellow on shrubs then give them a folate feed (liquid feed via watering can).
- Aerate lawn with a wire rake if mild and not waterlogged.
- Remove any dead, diseased or damaged growth from trees and shrubs.
- Finish mulching if not done in Autumn.
- Put manure / rose feed around all roses and check for dead, diseased or dying shoots.
- Deadhead bulbs regularly.
- Now is a good time to plant new Perennials and summer-flowering bulbs, top-dress all containers.
- Weed regularly.
- Edge / define all borders if not done already.

- Plant Roses.
- Sow hardy annuals for summer colour.
- Repair damage to lawns if necessary.
- Harden off hardy annuals sown under glass.
- Cut back any remaining growth from herbaceous / grasses left over from the winter.
- Divide summer flowering perennials like astrantia, hemorocallis, hosta etc.
- Coppice dogwoods / willows etc if not done before now.

Vegetable Garden:

- Prune Gooseberries and red and white currants. Remove deadwood and then spur prune all sideshoots back to 2 – 3 buds from the base. Shorten branch tips by one quarter.
- Direct sow shallots and onion setts.
- Harvest the last of the winter crops and compost any un- diseased debris.
- Sow aubergines, cucumbers, tomatoes and chillies in an indoor heated propagator.



STEYNING MUSEUM ARCHIVES

'Improverished Widows'?

An email from Australia to Steyning Museum opened the door to a fascinating story. Our elderly correspondent explained that before his mother died, she told him she had briefly lived in Steyning, where she attended a boarding school for girls at Jarvis House (now just Jarvis), the oldest house in Jarvis Lane. . . This girl's name was Dorothy Green and she boarded with the school's proprietors, Dr. Taylor and his disabled wife.

Dorothy's next words came as a terrible shock. 'Dr Taylor was your birth-father.' Her dying wish was that her son, her only child, should travel to England, to Steyning's Churchyard and place her ashes on Dr Taylor's grave - a promise that he fulfilled many years ago. However, he then wanted to find out more. Hence his emailed enquiry.

Our archives tell us that In the early 1900s there was indeed a small boarding school for girls at Jarvis, owned by the mysterious Dr. Henry Herbert Taylor, whose main claim to fame was being the Brighton pathologist who, in 1910 gave evidence against the infamous Dr. Crippen, who was hanged soon after for murdering his wife.

Dr Taylor's other claim was being the first man in the World to have a mechanical lift installed in his house. (There are still traces of every girl who wanted to take up his offer of it now.)

Dr Taylor was a rich and generous man. When his first wife died, he married a much younger woman and she continued to run the school. Meanwhile, with his considerable wealth, he

disused railway carriages, which were parked in the sidings of Steyning's nearby Railway Station and furnished them appropriately.

Of course it is true that there must have been a a large number of war-widows in the early twentieth century, but according to hearsay prevailing at that time, most or of these 'Impoverished Widows' were young and pregnant, some time after the wars. So perhaps a more apt title might have been 'Unmarried girls who had got into trouble'. In those days and in most families it was seen as shameful to have a baby out of wedlock. Thank goodness we have moved on from those difficult days 100 years ago!

Whatever we might think of Dr. Taylor, he did redeem himself to an extent, by depleting his own wealth to pay for the passage of a new start with her baby in Australia, with appropriate lodging and support set up for them to start their new lives.

Australian archives hold documents that demonstrate the success of Dr. Taylor's

scheme. Finally, whether a scholar or a victim, Dorothy Green certainly made a happy life for herself and her son.

Although he too has died, his own family live on to tell the tale.
