Council completes purchase of **Bramber Brooks to boost District's** biodiversity



Horsham District Council is excited to announce that it has now successfully purchased Bramber Brooks, securing this public green space both for the benefit of local communities and to provide a vital boost to local biodiversity in its goal for the Horsham District to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2050.

The site, which comprises some 34 acres of green space, is known as Bramber Brooks and benefits from public access, a private nature reserve and a community orchard, and Positively contributing to the Council's is currently enjoyed by many members of the

This successful acquisition will secure Bramber Brooks as public green space for the future in order to retain the community benefits of the land and enhance biodiversity on the site, ensuring that it will continue to operate as a well-loved and much enjoyed area for people to enjoy.

The site is already well-used by local people and has strong links with the local community through schools and scout groups.

Adding Bramber Brooks to the Council's countryside estate will benefit our District by:

Retaining public access to the land for residents and visitors Enhancing delivery of biodiversity

improvements via a fully funded Environment Agency approved project to create more wetland areas

Providing other improvements which could include, the introduction of seasonal cattle

grazing, thistle and bramble scrub control, formal rights of way improvements and improved signage for users existing successful flagship Wilder Horsham District initiative, delivering improvements to habitats and wildlife along the River Adur, as part of a wider nature recovery network. Horsham District Council Cabinet Member for Leisure, Culture and Green Spaces Cllr Jon Olson said:

"We're excited to confirm our acquisition of Bramber Books is now complete, and that ongoing public access has been secured for the local community.

"Managing this land within our countryside estate will also guarantee that proposals to improve the biodiversity of the site can move forward.

"This opportunity really underlines the Council's commitment to address the climate and ecological emergencies we all face, as we take real action to achieve net zero carbon emissions for our District and look to inspire greener futures."

March Steyning Community Orchard: What a wonderful world!

After my retirement last July, many asked, 'What will you do?'
Answer: Conservation/ regeneration. My faith has always led me towards tending to the preservation of our earth. This has led me to joining the Steyning Community Orchard Group, the Steyning Downland Scheme Maintenance Group ,the St Andrew's Churchyard Group and the Abbey Road Conservation Group.

Abbey Road in Steyning is where I live, and it has a special place in my heart, because our boys used to play there on the open ground. Over many years the footprint of the land has changed significantly. Recently I was shown a picture from 2009 of one part of the site which only had three trees on it. Now, there is an abundance of flora and fauna that is being maintained and formed into different habitats.

Central to one area, is a very large, semipermanent pond that fills with water from the land and floodwater from the nearby stream. Last year, we had a wealth of frogspawn, so we set up a night time camera, which showed a vast number of bright pairs of eyes staring back at us. That would explain the visitation from a Little Egret the following week! In the late spring and summer when the pond dries out, it is filled with Water Mint, Purple Loosestrife and a wide range of grasses. We have just coppiced many Goat Willows to let more light through the central section of the pond, so that more flora will be regenerated in what was previously a dark section with

little growth.

Earlier I mentioned about regeneration; this is because we are not only here to conserve, but add and replace trees and scrub that were there many years ago. We have been gifted nine native Black Poplar trees from Wakehurst Place, as they love wet ground. In addition, five Alders were planted last year, plus six Silver Birch, and ten Alder Buckthorn (to encourage the Brimstone Butterfly population), then thirty Hawthorns next to our new orchard. Our band of local volunteers, numbering about 12, have much to do, not only to maintain, but generate new habitats for everyone to appreciate. Last year for the first time, a Nightingale and Cettis Warbler were heard singing on site; a sure sign that everything we're doing is having a positive effect.

We are planning to have an Open Day at Abbey Rd in late April, to show everyone what we are doing here. Watch out for an item on that in the April 'Your Steyning'.

I read recently about the loss of orchards throughout Sussex and it made me want to weep. Steyning, however, is bucking the trend with three orchards; on the Memorial Playing Field, the Downland Orchard on the Steyning Downland Scheme Rifle Range and the newest one at Abbey Road. Over 100 fruit trees have been planted so far in our orchards.

We now have 9 apple trees at Abbey Rd planted over the last 2 years, with more being planned.








The Lost Railway

For nigh on 3 years the Steyning & District Community Partnership Visitor & Tourism Committee, has been diligently working on producing 4 railway boards to depict the history of the 2 railway stations - Steyning & Bramber - and the Steyning Line; all no longer in existence.

To start the ball rolling, information was collected from Steyning Museum with more input coming from several other local railway enthusiasts, all in order to put together the intricate story of this Lost Railway.

Once this first stage was in place, it passed to design with a member of the V & T Committee creating some beautiful and detailed illustrations to accompany the

text together with suggested materials to be used for the boards, etc. - a masterpiece.

Next on the list - sourcing the funding to enable us to produce the boards. We were very lucky to attract the

enthusiastic and generous support of the South Downs National Park together with Community Rail Development Fund, who together jointly agreed to fund the project.

At last we could start production! As well as depicting the railway history, there are also QR codes displayed that can be clicked on.

One will take you to more railway history from Steyning Museum; the next - ECHO - will give you audio commentary on the Steyning Line

and the final one will link you to a fun Augmented Reality figure of a Station Master

The boards are to be found in the vicinity of the Bramber Roundabout - the Steyning Board standing on its own just below Bramber Castle and the other 3 are grouped on the pathway leading to the routes taking walkers and cyclists up to the Downs - sited

behind some trees.

This group is actually on the spot where Bramber Station once stood.

At this moment, the Committee are still working on a convenient date to officially

celebrate the siting of these boards.

In the meantime they are there for all to see and enjoy - an interesting focal point to walk to when enjoying the Downs or the Downs Link, or even when you are just en route to Steyning or Bramber.

Please do look out for the date of the Celebration Day.
It will be a great occasion.






Wilding by Isabella Tree and Angela Harding Macmillan, £20 hardback





There are many types and causes of headaches. Muscle tension headaches and migraine headaches are by far the most common types, but sinus infections and other problems such as high blood pressure can also lead to headaches.

Regardless of the cause, if you have a headache, you want it to end. Fast!

This has produced a huge market for medications that cover up the symptoms of headaches. Powerful drugs can numb your nervous system so the pain doesn't register. The Wheatear



It's been a long winter, but rest assured that our summer migrant birds will soon be with us. As you read this, beating hearts and beating wings are powering tiny bodies through north African skies.

Wheatears are our earliest returning African migrants. It's a fast 3,000-mile flight from sub-Saharan Sierra Leone to Sussex for a 1-ounce Wheatear, and they've been recorded migrating at 500 miles a day. The dashing males arrive first, their soft, sunbleached shades of pink and buff topped with a dapper black bandit's mask.

At Sussex Wildlife Trust's Southerham nature reserve near Lewes, you'll see them scurrying over the grazed downland turf or perched along the valley's fence lines. When they fly, Wheatears flash the white rump which gives them their name. Because Wheatears have nothing to do with wheat or ears.

Their original name...well, courtesy prevents me from writing their old English name in such an upstanding publication - but let's just say they were named after their white behinds. Victorians and vicars bird watching in mixed company blushed when they were called upon to identify one, so their name was subtly censored.

Wheatear is a more palatable name for a

tragically palatable bird. In Sussex, Wheatears were considered a local delicacy and were served at the finest banquets in Lewes, Brighton and Eastbourne. Sussex shepherds would trap them to increase their income: in the late 19th Century the birds fetched 3/6d a dozen (£17.50 today). Shepherds could earn £14 per season (£1,260 today) trapping Wheatears - half their annual wage. Around the town, shepherds were eventually banned from trapping Wheatears as it distracted them from their sheep.

Gluttonous gourmets were so desperate for fresh Wheatear that they would prowl the downs and take birds straight from unmanned traps, leaving a pile of coins for the shepherds.

In 1900, outspoken and outraged Sussex conservationist W.H Hudson wrote, 'It is not fair that Wheatears should be killed merely to enable London stockbrokers, sporting men, and other gorgeous persons who visit the coast, accompanied by ladies with yellow hair, to feed on them at the big Brighton hotels.'

But the damage was done. Trapping and the gradual loss of their sheep-grazed downland habitat caused the birds to disappear from the Sussex downs. The Wheatears we now see around Lewes unsurprisingly don't hang around. Each spring they briefly return to their old downland haunts, flash their behinds at the people of Sussex and keep on moving.

From Lewes, they'll head onwards to breeding sites in northern England and northern Europe. But for some of these birds, their amazing migration continues for a further 2,000 miles across cold oceans to Greenland and Arctic Canada.



Many thanks to those of you who live on higher ground and have been asking for trees and hedges to be planted

there. This is of tremendous help to those who live at the lower levels who have been experiencing flooding. We have all seen the

pictures of the flooding at the Star Inn a few weeks back. We all know Steyning is bowl shaped so it is important to plant on higher ground to prevent run-off, as well as lower down to absorb the water there. This is something that SFT have been working very hard to do

Trees and hedges are well known to be a vital tool in preventing and controlling flood water. This is predicted to be an increasing problem with extreme weather conditions being caused by global warming. The Environment Agency advises that flood risk could double by 2055. We are so pleased that Richard Goring and the Wiston Estate are so conscious of this They are planting a one kilometre long hedge at the top of Mouse Lane and have asked Stevning For Trees to help.

We have already helped with the long hedge planted on SDS last year. We transferred the hedging plants ordered for another site to SDS with the help of their Project Manager. They were planted by SGS pupils. Our wonderful SFT volunteers were again at work before Christmas, despite difficult conditions under foot, gapping up this long hedge with tree whips provided by us.

After conversations with Richard Goring before Christmas we were delighted when he told us that he has commissioned a consultation on additional methods to control flooding e.g., the possibility of holding ponds, sluice gates etc. in the Mouse Lane area. He was letting the PC know.

We have been told that the Government say they are going to restore 30,000 miles of hedgerow by 2037 and 45,000 by 2050. Lets hope that's quick enough for our endangered species!

Pictured is the Woodland Trust printing paper which you can buy from Steyning Stationers. Sales of this contribute to its valuable work as the UK's leading conservation charity.

We were glad to be able to help Ronnie Reed refresh an old hedge by giving her some tree whips to plant, all helping the cause. Also giving Louise Crush some of our surplus whips - we know that she will give them a good home

She will be talking about the Saiga Antelope which she saved from extinction, and reasons




to be optimistic about the fight to save biodiversity. She and the antelope were featured in the television programme hosted by David Attenborough, Planet Earth II and III.

A headline read: 'Floppy-nosed antelope has baby boom raising hope for endangered species'. That hope was realised, but they are kept on the endangered list because of their vulnerability.



I am an artist and work in the medium of glass. I have always loved to make and create and glass is such a wonderful material to use. I love the vibrancy of colour that can de achieved, the way light transforms it, as well as the lustre, shine and smooth feel of it.

I graduated with my 3D design art degree 37 years ago and for many years worked mainly with sheet glass. I would slump, fuse and shape my forms using a kiln to heat and transform the flat glass into new and exciting vessel forms.

But more recently I have concentrated on the manipulation of glass rods and strips using a propane gas flame. This flameworking technique I like to think of my unique glass bead jewellery allows me to make and create in a more spontaneous way. I will start with one idea but it will often transform as I work on the piece into something else.

I love the serendipity of it and the kind of meditation that the focus on the glass in the

flame demands. Colour, nature and particularly wave forms are a large part of my inspiration and each bead I make is composed of the beauty of glass itself combined with my concentrated thought, creativity and passion.

March Gardening Journal

Come early march there is a glimmer of hope in the air as the days seem brighter and it feels like Winter is almost behind us. The plants in our gardens notice this change too - as the bulbs start flowering and the trees and shrubs start sprouting, we are provided with a new lease of life that helps to lift our spirits. By the end of the month, and as the weather warms up, there are more opportunities to get out and about and appreciate nature as it awakens from its winter hibernation. There are a few plants flowering at this time of year, but few with such a hot pink display as this months 'Plant of the Month'.

'Honesty' or Lunaria annua, is an old-fashioned dual-purpose plant, grown partly for its fragrant purple or white flowers in spring and early summer, but also for its unique oval and translucent seedheads, popular with driedflower arrangers.

It's properly grown as a biennial, and makes large, well-branched plants that flower in their second year, after which it will seed itself freely around the garden. However, smaller plants can sometimes be grown as hardy annuals from an early sowing, with a smaller flower display, but very good compact seed-heads.

Lunaria 'Chedglow' is having its moment in late February/early March - offering the garden its first flare of colour. Their liquorice foliage has an iridescent sheen, which adds depth to the surge of spring green as the flowering spikes rise to bloom. The dark, rich violet foliage really makes this plant shine and stand out from other Lunaria cultivars available to buy or grow from seed. Biennials and annuals are useful to add a lived-in feeling and for filling space whilst slower

arowing perennials find their feet. In the winter

months the silver penny seedheads of honesty are easily as wonderful as the flowers, catching the light and living up to their lunar imagery and so it is tempting to leave the plants standing. Be careful though, after a few years of self-seeding Be prepared to thin out the seedlings and be particular about where you want it to grow, its easy for a plant like this to be left to its own devices and run amok all over your garden.

Lunaria look best planted amongst the spring flowers of Brunnera, Narcissi, Geranium

maccrorizzhum and the lime green of Euphorbia. Planting it just behind some Geranium Rozanne will also mean you are able to complement the decorative seed heads of the Lunaria with the summer flowers of the Geranium. Overall, it's a great biennial for those you who don't mind a plant who likes to spread about and find a home in your garden where you may not have originally intended it to be.

Jobs to be done in March: Ornamental Garden:

- A general fertiliser could be applied over borders if felt necessary. If leaves look yellow on shrubs then give them a folate feed (liquid feed via watering can).
- Aerate lawn with a wire rake if mild and not waterlogged.
- Remove any dead, diseased or damaged growth from trees and shrubs.
- Finish mulching if not done in Autumn.
- Put manure / rose feed around all roses and check for dead, diseased or dying shoots.
- Deadhead bulbs regularly.
- Now is a good time to plant new Perennials and summer-flowering bulbs, top-dress all containers.
- · Weed regularly.
- · Edge/define all borders if not done already.
- · Plant Roses.
- · Sow hardy annuals for summer colour.
- · Repair damage to lawns if necessary.
- Harden off hardy annuals sown under alass.
- Cut back any remaining growth from herbaceous/grasses left over from the winter.
- Divide summer flowering perennials like astrantia, hemorocallis, hosta etc.
- · Coppice dogwoods/willows etc if not done

before now.

Vegetable Garden:

- Prune Gooseberries and red and white currants. Remove deadwood and then spur prune all sideshoots back to 2 – 3 buds from the base. Shorten branch tips by one quarter.
- · Direct sow shallots and onion setts.
- Harvest the last of the winter crops and compost any un- diseased debris.
- Sow aubergines, cucumbers, tomatoes and chillies in an indoor heated propagator.

Sheep Pen Lane or Schepynstrete

When browsing through the records of the Court of Morowspeche, a court held in Steyning in the Middle Ages, my eye was caught by a couple of slightly unusual entries. In 1465 we read that 'Thomas Rose (2d) barber keeps a certain dog as a guard - against the form of the statute'. One would imagine that guard dogs were not particularly uncommon but, for this, Thomas, the barber, was fined twopence. Maybe he had failed to keep his dog suitably tied up or kenneled as the law required him to do. Then, four years later he was in trouble again. 'Thomas Rose' the record said 'keeps a certain dog in the Schepynstrete to the great nuisance of his neighbours: a day is given to rectify the situation.' Once more he had failed to keep his dog under control.

The name Schepynstrete does not look or sound a lot like Sheep Pen Lane but that is where Thomas Rose had his barber's shop. It was quite possibly a muddy and rutted lane because in 1466 we hear that 'The king's highway towards the garden of William Pelet in the Scheppenstrete is in a bad state and needs repair.'

That these names would seem to have as much in common with the Middle English word chepynge, meaning a 'market place', as with the penning of sheep is a little confusing and the confusion continued as, over time, the spelling of the street's name was simplified.

When Richard Pellett made his will in 1531 he left monetary bequests totalling £194 plus 'the parsonage house at the Church style', 'the nuest myll in Stenyng', a considerable

volume of wheat and barley, 361 sheep and 1 cow, together with a barn in 'Sheping Strete'. Over the next 260 years there was little change in this spelling and, when it became necessary to make a record of all the people who had voted in the general

election of 1791 the saddler, the sawyer, the staymaker and a couple of labourers were all shown as living in Shippen Street. At the same time the Duke of Norfolk, who had an interest in the outcome of the election, got one of his employees, Jonathon Raine - who was not a Steyning man – to list the owners and occupants of all of Steyning's houses. He it was who first chose to call it Sheep Pen Street and later writers have staved with that reading of the name, explaining that it must have been where sheep were penned on their way to the weekly market. Despite the fact that it was the Reverend Cox who sequence of names for the street, he also tells of an old parishioner explaining that it was in the fields leading down to the present day cricket field, rather than in Sheep Pen Lane where 'the thousands of sheep which were brought over the Downs to the market

> there by their different owners'.

Open Field to the Downs. There was uncertainty over who should look after this track. Court rolls in 1476 demanded that 'burgesses (should) enquire who ought to repair the Kings Highway leading from the Prison House [the Stone House] towards le Portway, and ditch it on either side.' This trackway enabled the yeomen and husbandmen to take their carts and ox-drawn ploughs to the furthest limits of the open field, where the Portway Furlong lay, so it was important to keep it in good condition.

For a while the track leading to the Portway Furlong may, itself, have been known as 'the Portway' meaning the track which led to the market. However, it eventually acquired its present name of Newham Lane.

The origins of this apparently ordinary name are actually shrouded in as much uncertainty as those of Sheep Pen Lane - but that will need to be examined on another occasion.


