Weald to Waves



Let's do the bad news first; we are in the midst of a biodiversity crisis. This is not just something that is happening in the Amazon Forest, or about iconic creatures like polar bears hunting off floating Artic Sea ice. The crisis is here on our doorstep; with large numbers of our native species in decline. Birds, mammals, reptiles, invertebrates; everything that flies, crawls, swims, moves, at every level of the food chain is in trouble and facing an uncertain future. And the sad truth is, that Britain is among the most nature depleted countries on this, our planet.

The causes are many and complex; agricultural management of the land, climate change, the loss of wetlands and pristine freshwater habitats. urbanization, pollution, woodland management, invasive non-native species. In a word; us

The future for our wildlife looks bleak. A glass filled with gloom and darkness and despondency.

And then something happens, a spark, a light, and suddenly the glass clears and the future looks brighter.

An idea, a group of people can change things, turn things around and create something better. something remarkable.

'Weald to Waves' could be that idea, that group of people, shaping a better future not just for our wildlife but for us who depend on it for our own survival

'Weald to Waves' is an ambitious project created to

establish not one, not two, but three wildlife corridors running from Ashdown Forest through the Knepp Estate on the High Weald, along the river valleys of the Arun, Adur and Ouse, and down to the coast. Vital corridors that will enable our local wildlife to move easily from one area to another, spreading down through Sussex, improving our local biodiversity.

The project, co-ordinated by Libby Drew from the Knepp Wildland Foundation, has the support of Natural England, the South Downs National Park, The Sussex Wildlife Trust,

ongoing conservation projects like the Sussex Kelp Restoration Project and Wilder Horsham. The Ashdown Forest and land on the Barlavington and







October Steyning Community Orchard

We do hope those of you who had an excess of apples were able to take advantage of our day of juicing in the Memorial Playing Field in September. We made many litres of delicious apple juice - all from the fruit, you brought, perhaps a bumper crop in your

garden, or apples friends didn't want, or windfalls that might have gone to waste. We love seeing the joy and wonder in children's eyes when they make juice from their own apples and then taste it. What could be better!

On the 7th October at the Steyning Farmers Market, we will have a stall selling juice from local apples. This bottled juice will not have any preservatives added and will have been frozen immediately after it was juiced in September. Remember that once defrosted it must be drunk within 48/72 hrs otherwise it may start to ferment. This is not dangerous but will not taste as good....and is not quite the cider you might imagine results from fermenting apples – this needs to go through a very different process!!

But this is one of our dreams. Perhaps a cider maker might appear out of the woodwork of Steyning community and start making something wonderful from all our community apples. Cider making would certainly help keep our coffers full!

Selling the juice and our cards/notelets is an important part of our funding. Since we started nearly 80 fruit trees have been donated to our three orchards and there

is little space left for more. These donations were our original source of funding - for the purchase, planting and for the protective cages around the young trees. We still need to raise money for their ongoing maintenance.

Our orchards are now beginning to produce sufficient fruit for harvesting, which is exciting. This fruit does not belong to us, the SCO, but to the Community. We are the guardians and caretakers of these fruit trees and orchards. If and when you are picking fruit there, always remember to leave some of the others. Share and share alike! The community spirit!!

This year has been a bit of a roller coaster for the SCO - a wet February followed by a warm March and a very mixed April with unexpected frosts, disturbed the "normal" spring sequence.

Apple trees with early flowers, were damaged by this frost but the later ones were not. Initially, we imagined that there would a poor harvest, but our insect friends did a good job in pollinating the flowers that missed the frost, resulting in fruit filled branches. A couple were so laden that they broke under the weight of the fruit.

Thank you for your continuing support. We

are always looking for volunteers to help in the maintenance of our orchards.

We have monthly work days, so, come and join us, or when we hold 'events" we often need extra help. If the thought grabs you, please get in touch through our







LOCAL BUSINESS FOCUS

Hand & Wrist

The wrist and hand are extremely complex and have the ability to move with more precision than any other region in the body. There are 19 bones in the hand alone, 8 in the wrist and 2 in the forearm.

The wrists purpose is to function as a flexible **Strain** - Strains are link between the hand and the forearm. Because of its complexity, the frequency and diversity of the actions it is utilised in, the wrist is particularly prone to overuse, misuse and trauma

Symptoms that occur at the hand and wrist include, pain, ache, weakness, numbness, restricted movement and tingling (Paraesthesia).

Conditions treated:

Carpal Tunnel Syndrome - The carpal tunnel is a channel like structure through the wrist formed from bones and ligaments. Inflammation in this area can irritate the median nerve which passes through the tunnel. This can be painful, and cause numbness and tingling within the hand. Felt as pins and needles in the thumb, index and middle finger. Wrist, hand and finger stiffness often occurs, especially after rest. Often worse at night.

Tendonitis - Means inflammation of the tendons and is typically a repetitive strain injury. It is a common problem that can cause pain and swelling.

Tendinopathies: A gradual decrease in the strength of a tendon due to repetitive loading and often insufficient healing time between periods of stressful activity. Felt as pain at the wrist relating to specific activities.

Common in drummers, racquets sports, rowing and golf. It can also occur in patients with rheumatoid arthritis.

Sprain - Sprains are common injuries to the ligaments around the wrist joint. They are either caused by repetitive misuse or trauma and can cause swelling, pain and limit the use of the wrist and hand.

also common in the wrist, occurring when

the muscles are stressed beyond their comfortable limits, perhaps by overt trauma or repetitive use. Repeated loading such as with computer work, sports and manual labour can result in the gradual build-up of small amounts of damage to the various structures at the wrist and hand usually resulting in pain during a task or compression of structures that run through this region.

De Quervian's Tenosynovitis - Inflammation of the layer of tissue surrounding the tendon in the thumb, causing pain with movement.

Trigger Finger - Prevents smooth movement within the fingers causing 'locking' or 'catching'. It occurs when the tissues surrounding the finger tendons become inflamed and thickened. Caused by an increased friction of the tendon as it slides through its guiding sleeve at the finger. Associated with repetitive finger movement, sometimes initiated by a knock or blow (trauma).

Arthritic Pain: Aches and pain caused by osteoarthritis can be helped by techniques that improve joint mobility and reduce excess tension in the surrounding musculature.

Referred pain: Problems affecting muscle that originate from the elbow and forearm can be felt as pain at the wrist.





Hoverflies



Everyone loves bees, don't they? Knowing that our bees are in decline has prompted protests and petitions and highlighted the important service these buzzing pollinators provide to our planet. Without them our crops and ecosystems would collapse. Yet many other pollinators that provide the same service don't get the same level of public support. So today I'm waving my flag for the hoverflies.

For some reason, they're not as loveable as bees. Perhaps it's because most of the time people mistake them for wasps. This isn't totally our fault because that's exactly what the hoverflies want you to think. The 283 species of hoverfly in the UK come in many shapes, colours and sizes but most of them sport yellow and black stripes, making them easily confused for wasps, bees, hornets and bumblebees. It's a strategy called Batesian mimicry and was first proposed by Leicestershire lepidopterist Henry Bates in 1861. Hoverflies are harmless. They don't sting and can't bite but they have discovered you don't actually have to be dangerous to deter predators - you just have to look like something that's dangerous.

Yet their devious mimicry isn't the most incredible thing about them. Their wings are the things. Hoverflies (like all flies) have just two wings (half as many wings as bees and wasps). Whereas other flies keep their wings straight, hoverflies incline theirs to create an angled downward stroke at a remarkable rate of 120 beats per second. This allows hoverflies to fly to a most amazing place: nowhere. Hoverflies have become the motionless masters of mid-air

It's not all sitting around in the sky though.



During their few days of life, hoverflies fight, fornicate and feed and while busy collecting energy-giving nectar and protein-rich pollen they inadvertently provide that vital pollination service to our flowers and crops. And hoverflies have earned the title of 'The Gardeners Friend' because about 40% of them have a larval stage which is basically a tiny crawling stomach that roams around your flowerbed eating aphids.

Pollination, pest control – next thing you know these beneficial little insects will be mowing the front lawn for us too.

So why not thank these friendly flies by planting some of their favourite flowers in your garden - parsley, fennel, borage, hebe, sedum and alliums - and consider putting in a pond no matter how small. Do your bit for the pollinators and they'll keep the world working for us



Why is Biodiversity so Important?

Biodiversity is critical for our future. Species, and the ecosystems they form, make all aspects of human life possible. We depend on the natural services healthy ecosystems provide for every breath of air and every mouthful of food. Our whole society and agricultural system rely on the biodiversity of pollinators, soil organisms, natural predators of crop pests and many more. All are given homes and food in hedges and a diversity of native trees.

Some species are able to move and survive in a number of conditions. Hedgehogs and foxes for example, can adapt well to urban environments. But wildlife like the dormouse relies on the - source Woodland Trust.

Future Projects:

We have 6/7 hedges to plant this autumn which is great news as it will be firming up our wildlife corridors both through town and expanding out into the surrounding countryside. Many thanks to those who are taking these hedges and mini-copses on their land which are adding to our increasing ability to support biodiversity in and around this lovely town. This will make over 20 hedges planted. Additionally our 20 trees on verges/green spaces this autumn will enable SFT to reach the 100 mark of trees planted on verges, (we have only lost 3). We feel that at last our hard work will be paying off with these maturing trees absorbing carbon, shading our streets etc. Many thanks to all of you who have so ably supported this work by requesting trees, watering, volunteering to plant, mulching and funding us. For the first time we are being joined by Greening Steyning BAG hedgerow surveying team to plant at Ben Vick's lovely farm at Annington.

THORNSCROFT Many thanks to all our committee who have worked so hard to add this Green to our Shooting Field area. Persuading

the managing agent to let us plant our Dave Buckett designed mini-copses and allow the grass to grow. Thanks to Katie Parker, SFT committee member, through her expertise and hard practical work this area is already establishing. We will be working with Michael Blencowe on surveying this area. Also hoping that the managing agent will be encouraged to use this format on their other properties and estates.

Pains and Needles

Hello! My name is Jonathan, owner of Hawthorn Veterinary Surgeries, and for the quite a few years, I have been publishing my musings with a loose veterinary connection in some other local publications. I'm pleased to have been given the opportunity to share them in the Steyning magazine as well.

There have been plenty of practice sessions in the garden, and like many a father, I found myself reminiscing about the good old days of schoolboy cricket as I sent some loose deliveries down to a slightly disappointed 11 and 9 year old. However, unexpectedly, dreams became reality when I idly mentioned my whimsical aspirations whilst in the beer garden of the Royal Oak in Wineham. Having called my own bluff, I ended up in a pre-season net-session - the one opportunity to prepare for the list of compelling pub vs pub fixtures over the summer. I was more than prepared to give it a go. Despite being a wimp with needles, I can testify that it doesn't hurt a bit and thankfully I felt some near instant relief as a result.

It works by stimulating the body's repair mechanisms, regulating inflammation and causing the release of natural endorphins and opiods. It's most common indication is the relief of pain and muscle spasms, but there are many other indications such as gastrointestinal disease, skin problems and epilepsy to name a few. It is very safe in animals and has all the same benefits as it does in humans. It can be performed in the conscious animal and is excellent to help manage pain particularly in arthritic pets. October Gardening Journal

Autumn is a busy time of year for the gardener, with the changing light and cooler weather our borders start to fade. It doesn't have to mean the end of the gardening year, careful planning can still provide a crescendo of fiery colours to provide a dramatic crescendo to provide colour and interest well into the Autumn and beginning of Winter.

However, now is the time to start thinking about Spring. October is an ideal time to start planting your spring bulbs. By combining a simple mix of Narcissis, Tulips and Alliums you will be able to provide a colourful combination of flower in the garden from March until June.

Always buy more than you think you need, as often these displays look better en masse rather than a few flowers dotted here and there through your borders. A further tip would be to only plant the smaller narcissi in your borders as the big trumpet daffs are overpowering and thuggish amongst your other border plants.

Callicarpa Bodinieri Profusion commonly known as Beautyberry is a bushy, deciduous shrub which has long, mid green leaves which in the autumn months turn a wonderful rosy, red and pink colour. In July Callicarpa Profusion will bloom small lilac-coloured flowers, however the true star of the show is the strong, purple-coloured berries which are produced in large clusters covering the plant in the Autumn. Even when the leaves fall the berries remain which maintains the plants

interest for a longer season.

Callicarpa 'Profusion' originates from central and western China and is actually a plant belonging to the Mint family. It does well in a sunny, partially shaded area of the garden with well drained soil where it should thrive. It is low maintenance, generally disease and pest free and makes for a good garden plant for beginner and expert gardeners alike. While it requires little pruning, if space is limited it would benefit from a trim back to the main structure of the plant in early spring.

Bees and butterflies are drawn to their irresistible scent, making 'Profusion' a wonderful addition to your garden. Placed near a path or in a front garden, you can appreciate its beauty all year round. You can plant facing any direction, but results have shown that the west and south-facing plants produce more fruit.

Something to note around the gardens of Steyning is that the leaves will turn yellow if the soil is overly alkaline. Flowers should start to bloom in early July, meaning fruit will start to appear around September and die back in November.

Plant of The Month - Calicarpa profusion

Callicarpa will add a flash of colour in the garden when other plants start to fade, it's a versatile shrub which looks a bit drab over the summer months so its best to underplant it with summer flowering herbaceous like Geraniums, Nepeta or salvis to essure that you have some interest through the summer too

Jobs to do this month include: Ornamental Garden:

- Mulch borders with compost if not done in the spring.
- · Continue deadheading if weather is mild.
- Remove fallen leaves from Roses to prevent blackspot.
- Continue to tidy borders of weeds and leaves.
- Transplant any plants that need to be moved.
- Plant spring bulbs such as Daffodils etc. But NOT tulips – wait until November to avoid tulip blight.
- Lift and divide perennials.
- Plant up containers etc for winter bedding displays.
- · Apply autumn lawn feed etc.
- Now is a good time to plant trees and

- shrubs the soil is moist and warm. Sow sweet peas under glass.
- Can lift summer flowering bulbs / tubers and overwinter in greenhouse or can heavily mulch plants and leave in the ground. Eg gladioli, dahlia, canna.
- Cut back herbaceous perennials as they die back.
- Prune climbing roses to avoid wind rock.
- Refill bird feeders regularly.
- Install insect hotels / log piles.

Vegetable Garden:

- Begin planting garlic
- Apply fleece to late season crops when frost is forecast.
- Lift and divide rhubarb.
- Clear away old foliage of strawberries to prevent pest and diseases.
- Pot up herbs and take into frost free greenhouse or windowsill to continue cropping through the winter.
- Complete planting onion setts and plant out spring cabbage.
- Harvest squash and pumpkin if not already done so.

Odd Jobs of the past


When an archaeologist was recently given the job of examining the ground behind the old Lloyds Bank building, he came across a large stone slab. On moving it he found he was looking down a deep well with the top two to three metres being neatly lined with bricks. It had been dug, he concluded, during the 17th or 18th century.

It is a reminder that there were men, in the past, who followed very specialist occupations - John Norris, for instance, who, in 1614, the parish registers was described as 'a well digger'. 'Chummy' Greenfield was another such. Born in the 1880's he recalled, when interviewed in 1964, how he had spent many hours down wells at anything up to a depth of eighty feet, descending with the help of ladders and with light being provided by no more than a candle.

From time to time the burial records in the parish registers mention the occupations of those lying in our churchyard. Some were well established jobs which continue to this day, but whose names have changed, such as Thomas Constable, a roofer, who, when he died in 1615, was known as a 'stone heiler' or Edward Moon, a shoemaker who, in 1794, was called a 'cordwainer'.

Other terms, however, describe jobs which have completely died out. The 'peruke maker' who passed away in 1821 must have been men's wigs were concerned.

A 'shingler' is another trade which has disappeared. In Steyning, they were not uncommon up until the early 18th century when the shingled spire on the Church tower was replaced with what we



'Huckster' (a pushy door-todoor salesman), the more respectable itinerant 'Higgler' who had a

have now. In 1636, for instance, more than £6 was paid to the 'shinglers for shingling the church with 3,000 wooden shingles'. And how about Andrew Myas, the 'Saltpetre Man' - an unpopular trade because he could enter your stables or yard without permission in his search for putrefying topsoil to mix with ashes. It was a basis for the creation of saltpetre which was much in demand for the making of gunpowder in the 1600's.

Some of the occupations call for further explanation. John Razzall was the 'Wappingthtorne Gate-keeper'. He it was who collected the tolls from horsemen, drovers and all sorts of carts and carriages travelling down the turnpike road from Ashurst to Steyning.

There was also the 'inn holder at the Barracks canteen' in 1814 – a reminder that there was a substantial barracks on Castle Lane at the edge of the town during the Napoleonic wars. Farnefould Tayler's role as a 'ferryman' in 1627 is more of a puzzle. There one of the last of his breed, certainly as far as is no record of any local ferry across the Adur at that time.

One of the more curious occupations was that of the 'Meresman'. His role was to establish the exact boundaries of the parish. In the company of Meresmen from the neighbouring parishes he agreed which side of a ditch or hedge the boundary ran and whether it deviated at a particular marker stone or feature in the landscape. It was the route taken when the old men and boys of the village 'beat the bounds' with willow wands in rogation week; a ritual designed to pass on a physical memory of where the boundaries lay.

In 1871-3 these memories were put to good use. In preparation for the first 25": 1 mile issue of the Ordnance Survey map Steyning's Meresman drew every yard of the parish boundary in meticulous detail on a sheaf of little slips of paper and the information from

those slips of paper is still used on large scale boundary maps today.

These, of course, are relatively uncommon occupations. The parish registers are just as likely to mention commonplace lives such as 'a poor hemp dresser' or 'a base-born child' but they all provide a window into Steyning's

- Or work in the town or surrounding parishes.


It is the contribution to the town or Steyning residents that is significant in deciding whether an award will be made.
