### Front Cover: A Kind of Blue **Homage to Miles Davis**

Dave lived in the West Coast of the USA for most of the 1980's and was inspired by the "Hard Edge" school of painting that surfaced the in the 1960's. A selection of Dave's work in this style was on show for his exhibition at the Stevning Art Trail in 2022.

Hard Edge painting is characterized by large, simplified, usually geometric forms on an overall flat surface; precise, razor-sharp contours; and broad areas of bright, unmodulated colour that have been stained into unprimed canvas or board.

Dave is self-taught but has completed courses at Museum of Modern Art in New York, with Corev D'Augustine on Post-war Abstract Painting. He has also studied abstract acrylic painting at West Dean College with Robert Sosner and is currently being tutored at Emerson College by Richard Heys.

For over 30 years Dave has been a student of Zen Master Thich Nhat Hanh and finds that painting is

the perfect mindful meditation practice. where he can hopefully bring a sense of space, stillness, and emptiness to his work

### **September Steyning Community Orchard - Apple Juicing - Sunday 10th**

Come and join in with our Apple Juicing on Sunday 10th Sept. 13:00 - 16:00. In the Community Orchard on the Memorial Playing STEYNING COMMUNITY Field (Cricket Field)

The sound of voices drift across the Memorial way of life that has become a memory, but Playing Field and children's laughter lifts into the clear blue sky above and hangs in the warm air. Swallows, skimming low over the late brown, summer grass, wheel and turn, hunting for food.

In the distance, the clock looking down from its tower above the High Street chimes one. Lunchtime, and small groups of people are weaving their way from the Cricket Club on the edge of the green, around the cricket pitch, and up towards the corner of the playing field where the Community Orchard waits for them.

Here rows of fruit trees doze in the warmth of this early September afternoon. The Community Orchard is a special place. It belongs to everyone. The fruit trees have been donated by local people, planted and looked after by local volunteers and everyone can help themselves to the fruit.

The trees themselves are special. They are a link to our past; a more rural, slower, gentle



is something that we still carry inside us. They stand on the site of an older orchard planted in the late 1930's. A handful of those original trees are still here, and importantly, the present orchard now includes twenty-five Heritage trees, old Sussex varieties whose roots have gone down deep into the Sussex soil for centuries.

### The Community Orchard is special. The trees are special. And today is Special.

Today is another link with the past. Back in the 1930's early apples; sweet, and guick to ripen would have been eaten from the tree, later ones would have been stored in cool, dry barns and cellars. But the only other way to preserve apples to enjoy all year round was to juice them and make cider.

In keeping with tradition, today is Steyning Community Orchard's annual Juicing Day. The day when everyone is invited to come along with their apples, and turn them into juice to take home with them.

More people cross the playing field, some are just curious, many carry bags of apples picked from their own fruit trees and bottles



to put the juice in. The noise increases, and a crowd gathers on the edge of the orchard around the trestle tables which have been set up for the event. There are buckets for washing the apples, chopping boards and knives to cut the apples up. A gueue forms and everyone gets to work. The apples are chopped up before they are fed into a devilish looking funnel shaped machine with a set of blades at the bottom called a scratter. Children argue over who is going to turn the handle to make it work. As the apples drop through the blades, they are mashed up into a brown pulp which runs into a collecting bowl.

The orchard volunteers tip the pulp into one of the round wooden presses lined with muslin. The plates for squeezing the apple pulp are put in place and all that is left is to turn the screws that gently squeeze the juice into a metal base plate which channels it into a bucket beneath. There are squeals of delight as the juice is carefully poured into bottles ready to take home.

The afternoon drifts on, wrapped in warm autumn sunshine and the sounds of people coming together to enjoy being part of a tradition that stretches back into our past, until the shadows lengthen and the last apple is juiced.

Whether you have apples to juice or are just curious, come and join us on the Memorial Field on Sunday 10th September from 13:00 to 16:00. Everyone is welcome.





### Is now the time to go solar?

Have you been thinking of installing solar panels but have been unsure when to make the move? The best

time to install solar panels was 12 years ago. The second best is probably now.

Back in 2010 the government introduced a generous incentive scheme to kick-start the uptake of solar photovoltaic (PV) panels. At the time this was a relatively new technology, can now get affordable batteries that allow at least for domestic use, and systems cost £10,000 or more to install. To encourage homeowners to take the plunge they offered a generous 'Feed in Tariff' payment of 41.3p for every unit of electricity generated, index linked for 25 years. It was almost too good to be true, and over the next two years over 120 people in the BN44 area had panels fitted.

Perhaps your neighbour was one of those early solar pioneers. They will have paid off the capital cost by now. And with the Feed in Tariff having increased to 68.3p per kWh they'll be receiving a payment of £2000 or more each year from their energy supplier, quaranteed for the next 12+ years. No wonder they're smiling!

A lot has changed since then. The Feed in Tariff scheme has ended. Now you get paid a more modest 'Smart Export Guarantee' or SEG payment for every unit you feed back to the grid. This varies between 2p and 15p per kWh depending on your electricity supplier.

But prices of PV panels have also dropped steadily. So the up front costs are less than half what they were. The technology has also improved. Panels are more efficient these days and there are lots of smart options that reduce the impact of shading and allow you



to use solar energy to heat your hot water, or charge your electric car. Plus there have been big advances in battery technology. So you you to store excess energy during the day to make use of in the evening - all controlled from an easy-to-use phone app.

The environmental case for going solar has been strong from the outset. Clean, silent, and long lasting, a typical PV system will typically save over 800kg of CO2 emissions each year - about the same as driving a car 2000 miles.

But with the recent hikes in electricity prices the economics have taken a significant turn for the better. Every unit of power you save is worth two to three times what it was a few years ago. With all these factors added in, the payback time for a new solar installation has shrunk considerably and is now back to well under 10 years for many systems.

That's why now is great time to consider whether solar is a good solution for you. There's quite a few issues to think about. Is my roof suitable? Should I be thinking of a getting a battery too? How can I find a reliable installer?



### **News from your local Council**

### Fresh new face for SPC:



Following the local Council elections in May, SPC has a fresh new face with a total of seven new Councillors joining the fold.

New and continuing Councillors were welcomed to the start of their four-year term at May's Full Council meeting, and each member allocated Committee, working party and local 'body' representation seats according to their interests and personal expertise and experience.

'I joined the Community Committee because I'd like to work with our whole community so that together we can enjoy a happy, safe, vibrant town for residents and visitors,' comments new Councillor (Cllr) Vicci Johnson. 'I have a passion for nature and green spaces, their positive impact on physical and mental health and future of the planet, and I see an opportunity to improve our open spaces within the town and access to surrounding open spaces.'

Cllr Robin Ballance says, 'I joined the Planning and Premises Committee in order to use the expertise I have gained in my many years as an architectural designer

handling the complexities of planning applications across boroughs in London and throughout the UK'.

Taking up his seat on the Finance and General Purposes Committee Cllr Andrew Sharp, says, 'I hope that this is where my career experience in Economic Consultancy can make the most immediate and useful contribution to SPC. And more importantly, because we are all inevitably constrained in what we can do by the money available, it is careful financial management, and even more careful allocation, that underpins the best we can do on behalf of Steyning citizens'.

And Cllr Karon Foxwell, who sits on two committee's and has volunteered for a number of project specific working parties, says, in short, 'I hope to help Steyning move forward with fresh ideas, and I look forward to contributing to the community via my role as a Councillor'.

### Council plans a term of action:

Looking ahead to the next four years, SPC Councillors have drawn up an ambitious plan of action, including the prioritisation of over 70 proposed projects, so that, one hopes, the majority of them could be completed during the forthcoming term.

High on the list are a number of renovation and renewal projects including new equipment for several of the Council's playgrounds. The High Street Bus Shelter is in line for a number of improvements with already some work completed including doors and windows painted, flower filled hanging troughs and framed posters positioned, and a recycling bin installed close by. Also planned is improved lighting, more decorative works, upgraded accessibility and a locally sourced art installation.



Tackling anti-social behaviour {ASB} remains a primary objective of SPC for the next term. Planning is already in place for an improved state-of-the-art CCTV (closed circuit TV) system to give round-the-clock surveillance for some areas of the town, notably the High Street, but this will be subject to public consultation before any installation is approved. And the Council will continue to work closely with Sussex Police and its own Wardens to ensure regular town patrols, and effective reporting and action against ASB continue.

Recognising the need to provide for both the current and future Housing and Infrastructural needs of its residents, SPC will also be re-assessing its Neighbourhood Plan with a view to including a key housing component. And as skateboarding becomes an established Olympic sport, SPC plans to assess the practicality once again of installing a skateboard park for aspiring local skaters.

Looking forward to the next four years, SPC Chair Joanna Norcross comments, 'We have a number of exciting projects that we are discussing and hope to be able to progress and complete over the term of this Council. I am excited to be working with such an enthusiastic and energetic group of people,


many of whom are new to the Council, and I am confident that we will move forward in a positive and collaborative manner'.







But behind the curtains at Parn, a tech billionaire is playing God with a series of secretive IVF experiments. After baby Seth is born and handed over to his adoring parents, Talissa returns to the US but remains in contact with the family, and over the years, a bond develops. When Seth begins to attract media attention for certain unusual qualities, Talissa realises that his embryo has been the subject of genetic experiments.....A thoughtful, heartbreaking novel, with engaging main characters, set against a chilling vision of a shabby, post-Brexit Britain, and which asks big questions about science, ethics and humanity.



### **Rose-ringed Parakeet**

One of my favourite quotes from The Simpsons comes from Springfield's vet: 'I love animals. I spend my life saving them and they can't thank me. Well, the parrots can.' No animals are more famed for their ability to talk than parrots. Sure, their 'talking' is more mimicry than witty after-dinner conversation – a feathered echo chamber – but whether they're chanting 'pieces of eight' on a pirate's shoulder or swearing in front of Auntie Ethel, we humans have been entertained by their backchat for centuries.

There are around 400 species of parrot on our planet. Their native range encompasses pretty much everywhere south of the Tropic of Cancer. For us Brits their beautiful plumage liberated them from their plastic cage in his embodies the exotic; the mystery and excitement of faraway lands. So imagine my surprise when I first saw a big green parrot flying around in Sussex.

The Rose-ringed (or Ring-necked) Parakeet looks ridiculously out of place amongst our comparatively drab Starlings, Wood Pigeons and Crows. With its garish green plumage and red beak, it stands out like a clown who has gate-crashed a funeral. And with that squawk - that incessant, demented squawk - no surprise that a few slipped their chains there's no ignoring it.

South-east England's Parakeets are among the world's most northerly parrot populations but how did they get here? Some believe they made their great escape from an East London film studio in 1951, after starring



alongside Bogart and Hepburn in 'The African Queen'. Others claim that the Parakeets were set 'Stone Free' by Jimi Hendrix, who girlfriend's London flat. I rather like the idea of American sixties icons being responsible for the spread of non-native species across the UK. Perhaps Sonny and Cher smuggled Grey Squirrels in through customs under their furry waistcoats, or a tousle-haired Bob Dylan secretly released some American Mink out of the stage door of the Albert Hall in '66.

The truth is, with tens of thousands of Parakeets being imported into the UK it was and flew the coop.

Since the end of the sixties these free spirits have been recreating the Summer of Love across the capital. Forming feral colonies, the Parakeets have filled the air with their joyous, intolerable screeching and squawking; sounds that would make Hendrix and Dylan proud. And as for free love, their blatant fornicating in London's parks has led to a Parakeet population explosion. They were once established in the (sub)urban jungle of Brighton and lived in the trees of Hollingbury from 1977 until the mid-nineties. Surely it's only a matter of time before the Rose-ringed Parakeet moves into suburban Sussex.





### September Gardening Journal T: 01903 815065 M: 07866 747849

Gardeners may despair as September approaches, as it can often mean the decline of their borders as autumn approaches. But it doesn't have to be like that, September can be the culmination of the summer season with our gardens bulging with colour and texture. Including some late flowering herbaceous perennials, mixed with a few ornamental grasses enables you to create that crescendo to summer that everyone will be envious of. September is not a bad time to tweak your planting schemes either so it can be easy to add that splash of late season colour too.

Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert' is one of the most famous Anemone cultivars that was discovered in Verdun, France in 1858. It has large white flowers with a green centre and yellow stamens to top it off. It's quite a large plant that sometimes grows up to 4 ft tall and has a habit of creeping through your borders but don't let this put you off as this Anemone can provide you with a bright splash of white to brighten up those duller Autumn days.

Anemone is a herbaceous perennial genus that contains over 100 species that are native to temperate habitats all over the world.

Anemone means "daughter of the wind" in ancient Greekhence its sometimes called 'Windflower'. The Metamorphoses of Ovid tells us that the plant was created by the goddess Venus when she sprinkled nectar on the blood of her dead lover Adonis.

Anemone Honorine Jobert thrives in almost any soil and flowers throughout August, September & October. Its fully hardy with a Royal Horticultural Society Award of Garden Merit, clump forming and deciduous, it will

grow to a height of around: 90 - 1.20 cm (3 -4 ft) and a spread of: 45 - 75 cm (1.5 - 2.5 ft) within 2 to 5 years.

Planting Anemone on their own in largerthan-average clumps, yields a dramatic effect at this time of year when so many other perennials have gone over. It's a fabulous plant for brightening up those darker spots in the garden as it can be quite happy in some shade, however it will also grow happily in full sun too. These single flowered Japanese anemones are one of the plants traditionally associated with Japanese gardens, where they're grown against dark rocks or in the

shade of trees.

While Anemone can be a bit of a spreader it can be easily be kept in check if you dig out anything that comes out of the area you want it to grow. It looks great in association with ornamental grasses like Calamagrostis, Miscanthus and Panicum and can also work well with other late flowering herbaceous plants like Sedum, Dahlia & Aster. Its best to plant it with other plants that are vigorous otherwise you may find the Anemone will

invade its neighbours and eventually evict them too.

I prefer to use it for those shady spots as the bright white flowers really show up well against a darker background, I find that its spreading nature is also not quite so prolific in the shade either. It's a versatile and elegant plant that is worth considering of you want to Vegetable Garden: add a splash of colour into your garden in the autumn.

### Jobs to do this month include: **Ornamental Garden:**

- · Continue to deadhead
- Trim Lavenders to woody growth to keep them compact.
- Begin to clear leaves as necessary.
- · Keep borders clear of weeds.
- Take cuttings of tender perennials.
- Continue to deadhead bedding plants.
- Plan for next year's garden displays.
- Collect seed from perennials / hardy annuals.

- · Start planting spring bulbs.
- Lift and divide herbaceous perennials.
- · Start planting trees and shrubs towards the end of the month and move evergreen shrubs etc while the soil is still warm.
- · Collect and get rid of any infected roses leaves.

- Once the tassels on sweet corn have turned brown check whether the cobs are ready to harvest. When ripe the kernels contain a milky liquid.
- Leave marrows, squashes, pumpkins etc., to ripen on the plant. Place fruit on a wooden board to prevent soiling.
- · Plant onions/shallots suitable for over wintering (on heavy wet soils spring planting may be preferable).
- · Continue harvesting fruit.
- · Harvest main crop potatoes.
- · Sow winter greens such as land cress, mustard spinach, corn salad and hardy lettuce cultivars.

### A Peculiar Phenomenon - the Laki Haze

It was June 1783 when the air thickened and turned into a yellow haze, obscuring the strangely blood-red sun. As workers left their homes the first morning, they must have wondered at this strange sight. However, before long their wonderment turned into fear as they began to rasp and splutter in the acrid atmosphere, coughing as if their lungs were on fire.

Those who worked on the land found their livestock similarly affected and some of their crops beginning to wither.

Diarist Gilbert White wrote graphic descriptions of what he saw:

'The summer of the year 1783 was an amazing and portentous one, full of horrible phenomena, for besides the alarming meteors and the tremendous thunder-storms hemisphere. It was this toxic mixture that that affrighted and distressed the different counties of this kingdom, the peculiar haze or smoky fog that prevailed for many weeks in this island... was a most extraordinary appearance, unlike anything known within the memory of man.'

Indeed, this 1783 summer was both the hottest and the coldest on record: 'the heat was so intense that the butcher's meat could hardly be eaten the day after it was killed, and the flies swarmed so in the lanes and hedges that they rendered the horses frantic.'

Yet by dawn on some summer mornings, thick frost blanketed the ground. Steying Museum's researchers discovered this episode in our history when searching the Steyning parish registers for a particular burial, only to find more deaths than expected in the mid 1780's.

### Were these two findings connected?


Further research revealed a contemporary newspaper report that Laki, an Icelandic volcano had begun erupting on 6th June 1783 and continued without pause until February 1784, spewing out poisonous clouds of Sulphuric acids and gases which quickly covered the whole of the northern attacked the lungs of people and animals alike, causing their internal tissues to swell, hence their choking coughs.

Most harvests failed that year, though our wheat was apparently unaffected, thus helping to prevent starvation, but many local families had meagre rations to see them through the freezing winter of 1783-1784.

Turning back to the burials listed in the parish registers of Steyning and adjoining communities, we wondered whether our findings would be the same for all five

> parishes and how would they compare with national death rates? Our analysis below focuses on the deaths recorded in the six months following mid-June 1783, compared with deaths in the same period the previous year.

All five parishes recorded dramatic

increases in numbers of deaths as follows:

X 3 Upper Beeding Steyning X 2 Bramber X 4 Wiston X 6 Ashurst X 6

The equivalent figure for deaths in this period across Britain was 3 times the previous average.

Similar variations in the national figures also confirm our suspicion that the higher numbers of deaths in Ashhurst and Wiston must be due to their being our most rural parishes, with greater numbers of outdoors workers.

Many of the deaths may have been of key tradesmen, craftsmen, farmers and other essential workers, whose loss must have impacted badly, not only on their families but also on the economies services and provisions in their communities ... but that will be a study for another time.


